<b>unfluctuating</b>	Not liable to fluctuate or especially to fall.

**unwaveringly** With resolute determination.

<b>hardness</b>	Devoid of passion or feeling; hardheartedness. <i>A lack of mental <b>hardness</b>.</i>
<b>inelasticity</b>	The lack of elasticity.
<b>inflexible</b>	Incapable of change. <i>Once she had made up her mind she was <b>inflexible</b>.</i>
<b>insistent</b>	Continuing in a prolonged and demanding way. <i>She was very <b>insistent</b> that I call her.</i>
<b>martinet</b>	Someone who demands exact conformity to rules and forms. <i>A <b>martinet</b> of a staff officer.</i>
<b>obduracy</b>	Resoluteness by virtue of being unyielding and inflexible.
<b>resolute</b>	Admirably purposeful, determined, and unwavering. <i>Stood <b>resolute</b> against the enemy.</i>
<b>resolved</b>	Firmly determined to do something. <i>She was firmly <b>resolved</b> to be a doctor.</i>
<b>rigid</b>	Not able to be changed or adapted. <i><b>Rigid</b> bureaucratic controls.</i>
<b>rigor</b>	The quality of being valid and rigorous. <i>The <b>rigors</b> of boot camp.</i>
<b>rigorous</b>	Harsh and demanding. <i><b>Rigorous</b> application of the law.</i>
<b>rigour</b>	Harsh and demanding conditions. <i>The full <b>rigour</b> of the law.</i>
<b>severity</b>	Used of the degree of something undesirable e.g. pain or weather. <i>She stared at me with mock <b>severity</b>.</i>
<b>solid</b>	A substance or object that is solid rather than liquid or fluid. <i>Carved out of <b>solid</b> rock.</i>
<b>stern</b>	Of a stern or strict bearing or demeanor forbidding in aspect. <i><b>Stern</b> measures to restrict vehicle growth.</i>
<b>stiffness</b>	The quality of being firm and difficult to bend or move. <i>The <b>stiffness</b> of the cotton.</i>
<b>stoutly</b>	In a resolute manner. <i>She <b>stoutly</b> defends her action.</i>
<b>strict</b>	Characterized by strictness severity or restraint. <i>My father was very <b>strict</b>.</i>
<b>strictly</b>	Restricted to something. <i>These foods are <b>strictly</b> forbidden.</i>



**stringent** Demanding strict attention to rules and procedures.  
***Stringent** guidelines on air pollution.*

**strongly** In a powerful manner.  
*I **strongly** believed in the importance of what I did.*

**unbending** Reserved, formal, or strict in one's behaviour or attitudes; austere and inflexible.  
*His output is prodigious and springs from the **unbending** control he exercises over every aspect of his life.*

**uncompromising** Not making concessions.  
*She was **uncompromising** in her convictions.*

**unyielding** Stubbornly unyielding.  
*The Atlantic hurled its waves at the **unyielding** rocks.*
