| acceptable | Judged to be in conformity with approved usage. <i>Some coffee would be most acceptable.</i> |
| adapt | Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions. <i>The policies can be adapted to suit individual needs.</i> |
| adaption | The process of adapting to something (such as environmental conditions). |
| apposite | Being of striking appropriateness and pertinence. <i>The successful copywriter is a master of apposite and evocative verbal images.</i> |
| appropriate | Suitable or proper in the circumstances. <i>The accused had appropriated the property.</i> |
| compatibility | A feeling of sympathetic understanding. <i>He argues for the compatibility of science and religion.</i> |
| compatible | Able to exist and perform in harmonious or agreeable combination. <i>The printer is fully compatible with all leading software.</i> |
| conformance | Correspondence in form or appearance. <i>Conformance to international standards.</i> |
| conforming | Adhering to established customs or doctrines (especially in religion). |
| congruous | Corresponding in character or kind. <i>This explanation is congruous with earlier observations.</i> |
| conversion | An event that results in a transformation. <i>You ll see better conversion rates for your local advertising if you include your physical address on your website.</i> |
| convert | A person who has been converted to another religious or political belief. <i>The substance converts to an acid.</i> |

| correct | Correct in opinion or judgment. <i>Motorists can have their headlights tested and corrected at a reduced price on Saturday.</i> |
| <u>correspond</u> | Be analogous or equivalent in character, form, or function. <i>Communication is successful when the ideas in the minds of the speaker and hearer correspond.</i> |
| eligible | (of a person) desirable or suitable as a partner in marriage. <i>Eligible candidates.</i> |
| germane | Relevant and appropriate. <i>He asks questions that are germane and central to the issue.</i> |
| harmonious | Free from disagreement or dissent. <i>The tailored clothes were harmonious with her military bearing.</i> |
| <u>identical</u> | (of twins) developed from a single fertilized ovum, and therefore of the same sex and usually very similar in appearance. <i>Cars identical except for their license plates.</i> |
| perfect | A tense of verbs used in describing action that has been completed sometimes regarded as perfective aspect. <i>Equity will not perfect an imperfect gift.</i> |
| perfectly | Used for emphasis, especially in order to assert something that has been challenged or doubted. <i>The ring fitted perfectly.</i> |
| pertinent | Being of striking appropriateness and pertinence. <i>A list of articles pertinent to the discussion.</i> |
| <u>propriety</u> | The condition of being right, appropriate, or fitting. <i>He always behaved with the utmost propriety.</i> |
| rearrange | Change (the position, time, or order of something). <i>She rearranged her skirt as she sat back in her chair.</i> |
| <u>relevant</u> | Closely connected or appropriate to what is being done or considered. <i>Critics may find themselves unable to stay relevant in a changing world.</i> |
| right | In the right manner. <i>That sausage doesn't smell right.</i> |
| snug | Fitting closely but comfortably. <i>A snug house.</i> |
| <u>suitable</u> | Right or appropriate for a particular person, purpose, or situation. <i>A tractor suitable or fit for heavy duty.</i> |
| symphonic | Relating to or characteristic or suggestive of a symphony. <i>The symphonic hum of a million insects.</i> |

unexceptionable Completely acceptable; not open to exception or reproach.
*A judge's ethics should be **unexceptionable**.*

unobjectionable Not causing disapproval.
***Unobjectionable** behavior.*
