Associations of "Fits and starts" (30 Words)

acceptable	Adequate for the purpose. <i>An acceptable substitute for champagne.</i>
adapt	Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions. <i>Hospitals have had to be adapted for modern medical practice.</i>
adaption	The process of adapting to something (such as environmental conditions).
opposite	Apt in the circumstances or in relation to something. <i>The successful copywriter is a master of opposite and evocative verbal images.</i>
appropriate	Give or assign a resource to a particular person or cause. <i>It seems that an apology is appropriate.</i>
begin	Begin an event that is implied and limited by the nature or inherent function of the direct object. <i>You cannot even begin to understand the problem we had to deal with during the war.</i>
commence	Set in motion, cause to start. <i>A public inquiry is due to commence on the 16th.</i>
compatibility	The ability of one computer, piece of software, etc. to work with another. <i>Software compatibility is another important factor to consider.</i>
compatible	Able to exist and perform in harmonious or agreeable combination. <i>The symptoms were compatible with gastritis or a peptic ulcer.</i>
conformance	Correspondence in form or appearance. <i>Conformance testing.</i>
conforming	Adhering to established customs or doctrines (especially in religion).
congruous	In agreement or harmony. <i>This explanation is congruous with earlier observations.</i>

<u>conversion</u>	The action of wrongfully dealing with goods in a manner inconsistent with the owner's rights. <i>You ll see better conversion rates for your local advertising if you include your physical address on your website.</i>
convert	A person who has been converted to another religious or political belief. <i>Could you convert my dollars into pounds.</i>
correct	Socially right or correct. <i>Engineers will work to correct the effects or air resistance.</i>
<u>correspond</u>	Communicate by exchanging letters, emails, or other messages. <i>The carved heads described in the poem correspond to a drawing of Edgcote House.</i>
eligible	(of a person) desirable or suitable as a partner in marriage. <i>Eligible candidates.</i>
<u>identical</u>	Derived from a single egg or ovum. <i>Identical triangles.</i>
launch	An act or instance of launching something. <i>I launched myself out of bed.</i>
perfectly	Completely and without qualification; used informally as intensifiers. <i>A perfectly idiotic idea.</i>
pertinent	Having precise or logical relevance to the matter at hand. <i>Practitioners must consider all factors pertinent to a situation.</i>
<u>pioneer</u>	Open up a road or terrain as a pioneer. <i>The technique was pioneered by a Swiss doctor in the 1930s.</i>
rearrange	Change the position of. <i>Rearrange the furniture in my room.</i>
<u>relevant</u>	Having a bearing on or connection with the subject at issue. <i>The scientist corresponds with colleagues in order to learn about matters relevant to her own research.</i>
snug	Place (something) safely or cosily. <i>A snug house.</i>
<u>suitable</u>	Right or appropriate for a particular person, purpose, or situation. <i>These toys are not suitable for children under five.</i>
symphonic	Relating to or written for a symphony orchestra. <i>Symphonic and chamber music.</i>
trailblazer	Someone who marks a trail by leaving blazes on trees. <i>He was a trailblazer for many ideas that are now standard fare.</i>

unexceptionable Not open to objection, but not particularly new or exciting.
The **unexceptionable** belief that society should be governed by law.

unobjectionable Not causing disapproval.
The bail conditions were **unobjectionable** as far as he was concerned.
