## Associations of "Fits and starts" (30 Words)

<b>acceptable</b>	Adequate for the purpose. <i>An <b>acceptable</b> substitute for champagne.</i>
<b><a href="#">adapt</a></b>	Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions. <i>Hospitals have had to be <b>adapted</b> for modern medical practice.</i>
<b>adaption</b>	The process of adapting to something (such as environmental conditions).
<b><a href="#">apposite</a></b>	Apt in the circumstances or in relation to something. <i>The successful copywriter is a master of <b>apposite</b> and evocative verbal images.</i>
<b>appropriate</b>	Give or assign a resource to a particular person or cause. <i>It seems that an apology is <b>appropriate</b>.</i>
<b>begin</b>	Begin an event that is implied and limited by the nature or inherent function of the direct object. <i>You cannot even <b>begin</b> to understand the problem we had to deal with during the war.</i>
<b><a href="#">commence</a></b>	Set in motion, cause to start. <i>A public inquiry is due to <b>commence</b> on the 16th.</i>
<b>compatibility</b>	The ability of one computer, piece of software, etc. to work with another. <i>Software <b>compatibility</b> is another important factor to consider.</i>
<b>compatible</b>	Able to exist and perform in harmonious or agreeable combination. <i>The symptoms were <b>compatible</b> with gastritis or a peptic ulcer.</i>
<b>conformance</b>	Correspondence in form or appearance. <i><b>Conformance</b> testing.</i>
<b>conforming</b>	Adhering to established customs or doctrines (especially in religion).
<b>congruous</b>	In agreement or harmony. <i>This explanation is <b>congruous</b> with earlier observations.</i>

<b><u>conversion</u></b>	The action of wrongfully dealing with goods in a manner inconsistent with the owner's rights. <i>You ll see better <b>conversion</b> rates for your local advertising if you include your physical address on your website.</i>
<b>convert</b>	A person who has been converted to another religious or political belief. <i>Could you <b>convert</b> my dollars into pounds.</i>
<b>correct</b>	Socially right or correct. <i>Engineers will work to <b>correct</b> the effects or air resistance.</i>
<b><u>correspond</u></b>	Communicate by exchanging letters, emails, or other messages. <i>The carved heads described in the poem <b>correspond</b> to a drawing of Edgcote House.</i>
<b>eligible</b>	(of a person) desirable or suitable as a partner in marriage. <i><b>Eligible</b> candidates.</i>
<b><u>identical</u></b>	Derived from a single egg or ovum. <i><b>Identical</b> triangles.</i>
<b>launch</b>	An act or instance of launching something. <i>I <b>launched</b> myself out of bed.</i>
<b>perfectly</b>	Completely and without qualification; used informally as intensifiers. <i>A <b>perfectly</b> idiotic idea.</i>
<b>pertinent</b>	Having precise or logical relevance to the matter at hand. <i>Practitioners must consider all factors <b>pertinent</b> to a situation.</i>
<b><u>pioneer</u></b>	Open up a road or terrain as a pioneer. <i>The technique was <b>pioneered</b> by a Swiss doctor in the 1930s.</i>
<b>rearrange</b>	Change the position of. <i><b>Rearrange</b> the furniture in my room.</i>
<b><u>relevant</u></b>	Having a bearing on or connection with the subject at issue. <i>The scientist corresponds with colleagues in order to learn about matters <b>relevant</b> to her own research.</i>
<b>snug</b>	Place (something) safely or cosily. <i>A <b>snug</b> house.</i>
<b><u>suitable</u></b>	Right or appropriate for a particular person, purpose, or situation. <i>These toys are not <b>suitable</b> for children under five.</i>
<b>symphonic</b>	Relating to or written for a symphony orchestra. <i><b>Symphonic</b> and chamber music.</i>
<b>trailblazer</b>	Someone who marks a trail by leaving blazes on trees. <i>He was a <b>trailblazer</b> for many ideas that are now standard fare.</i>

**unexceptionable** Not open to objection, but not particularly new or exciting.  
The **unexceptionable** belief that society should be governed by law.

**unobjectionable** Not causing disapproval.  
The bail conditions were **unobjectionable** as far as he was concerned.
