<b>locating</b>	A determination of the place where something is.
<b>location</b>	An actual place or natural setting in which a film or broadcast is made, as distinct from a simulation in a studio. <i>The <b>location</b> of new housing beyond the existing built up areas.</i>
<b>mend</b>	A repair in a material. <i>Her stockings had several <b>mends</b>.</i>
<b>mending</b>	Sewing that repairs a worn or torn hole (especially in a garment). <i>A muddle of books and <b>mending</b>.</i>
<b>mess</b>	A meal eaten in a mess hall by service personnel. <i>I look a <b>mess</b>.</i>
<b>muddle</b>	Informal terms for a difficult situation. <i>She was able to cut through confusion and <b>muddle</b>.</i>
<b>pickle</b>	A pickled cucumber. <i>I am in a <b>pickle</b>.</i>
<b>repair</b>	The action of repairing something. <i>The hospital is in a bad state of <b>repair</b>.</i>
<b><u>reparation</u></b>	Compensation exacted from a defeated nation by the victors. <i>An act for which there is no <b>reparation</b>.</i>

<b>fixate</b>	Make fixed, stable or stationary. <i>Subjects <b>fixated</b> a central point.</i>
<b>furbish up</b>	Polish and make shiny.
<b>gear up</b>	Set the level or character of.
<b>get</b>	Take vengeance on or get even. <i>You don t want to <b>get</b> into debt.</i>
<b>limit</b>	Place limits on extent or access. <i>Try to <b>limit</b> the amount you drink.</i>
<b>make</b>	Make or cause to be or to become. <i>Can you <b>make</b> me an omelette.</i>
<b>mend</b>	Return to health; heal. <i>Workmen were <b>mending</b> faulty cabling.</i>
<b>pay back</b>	Cancel or discharge a debt.
<b>pay off</b>	Be worth it.
<b>posit</b>	Put in position place. <i>The Confucian view <b>posits</b> a perfectible human nature.</i>
<b>prepare</b>	Prepare for eating by applying heat. <i>Alkanes may be <b>prepared</b> by the removal of carbon dioxide from the corresponding carboxylic acid.</i>
<b>ready</b>	Make ready or suitable or equip in advance for a particular purpose or for some use event etc. <i>Get the children <b>ready</b> for school.</i>
<b>repair</b>	Make good (damage). <i>He <b>repaired</b> to his cabin in the woods.</i>
<b>restore</b>	Restore by replacing a part or putting together what is torn or broken. <i>The week at the spa <b>restored</b> me.</i>

<b>secure</b>	Make certain of. <i>Doors are likely to be well <b>secured</b> at night.</i>
<b>set</b>	Set to a certain position or cause to operate correctly. <i>The goldsmith <b>set</b> the diamond.</i>
<b>set up</b>	Urge to attack someone.
<b>situate</b>	Determine or indicate the place, site, or limits of, as if by an instrument or by a survey. <i>The pilot light is usually <b>situated</b> at the front of the boiler.</i>
<b>specify</b>	Specify as a condition or requirement in a contract or agreement make an express demand or provision in an agreement. <i>The agency failed to <b>specify</b> that the workers were not their employees.</i>
<b>sterilise</b>	Make free from bacteria.

<b>emendation</b>	The process of making a revision or correction to a text. <i>Here are some suggested <b>emendations</b>.</i>
<b>fixing</b>	The action of fastening something in place. <i>The <b>fixing</b> of additional strengthening steelwork.</i>
<b>glue</b>	Be fixed as if by glue. <i>His eyes were <b>glued</b> on her.</i>
<b>mechanic</b>	A craftsman skilled in operating machine tools. <i>A car <b>mechanic</b>.</i>
<b>mend</b>	Heal or recover. <i>Her stockings had several <b>mends</b>.</i>
<b>modify</b>	Transform (a structure) from its original anatomical form during development or evolution. <i>She may be prepared to <b>modify</b> her views.</i>

<b>patch</b>	Place a patch over a good eye in order to encourage a lazy eye to work. <i>Synth <b>patches</b> over an endless drum pattern.</i>
<b>posit</b>	A proposition that is accepted as true in order to provide a basis for logical reasoning. <i>These plots are <b>posited</b> on a false premise about women s nature as inferior.</i>
<b>reanimate</b>	Give fresh vigour or impetus to. <i>His personal dislike of the man was <b>reanimated</b>.</i>
<b>rectify</b>	Purify or refine (a substance) by repeated or continuous distillation. <i><b>Rectify</b> the inequities in salaries.</i>
<b>refit</b>	Replace or repair machinery, equipment, and fittings in (a ship, building, etc). <i>The <b>refit</b> of ships damaged by enemy action.</i>
<b>remedial</b>	Giving or intended as a remedy or cure. <i><b>Remedial</b> surgery.</i>
<b>remedy</b>	The margin within which coins as minted may differ from the standard fineness and weight. <i>Compensation is available as a <b>remedy</b> against governmental institutions.</i>
<b>renovation</b>	The action of renovating a building. <i>This property is in need of complete <b>renovation</b>.</i>

<b>repair</b>	A result of repairing something. <i>One can never fully <b>repair</b> the suffering and losses of the Jews in the Third Reich.</i>
<b>revamp</b>	Give new and improved form, structure, or appearance to. <i>An attempt to <b>revamp</b> the museum's image.</i>
<b>revisal</b>	The act of rewriting something.
<b>revise</b>	Revise or reorganize especially for the purpose of updating and improving. <i>He had cause to <b>revise</b> his opinion a moment after expressing it.</i>
<b>set</b>	Set down according to a plan. <i><b>Set</b> a record.</i>
<b>situate</b>	Situated. <i>Amy is now comfortably <b>situated</b>.</i>
<b>welder</b>	Joins pieces of metal by welding them together. <i>He worked as a <b>welder</b> in a steel factory.</i>
