mending	Sewing that repairs a worn or torn hole (especially in a garment). <i>A muddle of books and mending.</i>
mess	A meal eaten in a mess hall by service personnel. <i>I look a mess.</i>
muddle	Informal terms for a difficult situation. <i>She was able to cut through confusion and muddle.</i>
pickle	A pickled cucumber. <i>I am in a pickle.</i>
repair	The action of repairing something. <i>The hospital is in a bad state of repair.</i>
<u>reparation</u>	Compensation exacted from a defeated nation by the victors. <i>An act for which there is no reparation.</i>
