Synonyms of "Flabbergasted" as an adjective (6 Words)

	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise.
<u>dumbfounded</u>	<i>A circle of policemen stood dumbfounded by her denial of having seen the accident.</i>
dumbstricken	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise.
dumbstruck	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise. <i>He was dumbstruck with terror.</i>
dumfounded	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise.
stupefied	In a state of mental numbness especially as resulting from shock. <i>Lay semiconscious stunned or stupefied by the blow.</i>
thunderstruck	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise. <i>Was thunderstruck by the news of his promotion.</i>

- *Flabbergasted fans took to the streets to celebrate the team's big win.*
- *This news has left me totally flabbergasted.*
- *The flabbergasted aldermen were speechless.*

amazed	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. <i>She shook her head in amazed disbelief.</i>
astonish	Affect with wonder. <i>You never fail to astonish me.</i>
<u>astonished</u>	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. <i>He was astonished at the change in him.</i>
<u>astonishing</u>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>I find it astonishing that they ever thought it could work.</i>
astounded	Affect with wonder. <i>Her bluntness astounded him.</i>
astounded	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. <i>Astounded viewers wept at the pictures from the Oklahoma City bombing.</i>
<u>astounding</u>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>An astounding achievement.</i>
awesome	Extremely well; excellently. <i>The awesome power of the atomic bomb.</i>
<u>daze</u>	A state of stunned confusion or bewilderment. <i>He was walking around in a daze.</i>
incredible	Very good; wonderful. <i>An almost incredible tale of triumph and tragedy.</i>
<u>marvelous</u>	Being or having the character of a miracle. <i>A marvelous collection of rare books.</i>
prodigious	So great in size or force or extent as to elicit awe. <i>The stove consumed a prodigious amount of fuel.</i>
<u>puzzled</u>	Filled with bewilderment. <i>She looked puzzled and angry with him.</i>

redoubtable	Worthy of respect or honor. <i>The redoubtable ladies.</i>
serendipity	Good luck in making unexpected and fortunate discoveries. <i>A fortunate stroke of serendipity.</i>
<u>shattered</u>	Exhausted. <i>I usually feel too shattered to do more than crawl into bed.</i>
shock	Subject to electrical shocks. <i>She was shocked at the state of his injuries.</i>
<u>shocked</u>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
<u>shocking</u>	Glaringly vivid and graphic; marked by sensationalism. <i>Shocking behaviour.</i>
<u>staggering</u>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>The amount of money required was staggering.</i>
<u>startle</u>	Move or jump suddenly, as if in surprise or alarm. <i>A sudden sound in the doorway startled her.</i>
stun	Hit something or somebody as if with a sandbag. <i>Stun fish.</i>
stupefy	Make (someone) unable to think or feel properly. <i>The offence of administering drugs to a woman with intent to stupefy her.</i>
surprise	Cause to be surprised. <i>Surprise major.</i>
surprised	Taken unawares or suddenly and feeling wonder or astonishment. <i>Surprised by her student s ingenuity.</i>
<u>surprising</u>	Causing surprise; unexpected. <i>A surprising sequence of events.</i>
unexpectedly	Without advance planning. <i>Tourist chiefs reported unexpectedly high visitor numbers.</i>
wonderful	Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. <i>They all think she s wonderful.</i>
<u>wondering</u>	Showing curiosity. <i>Peter listened with an air of wondering astonishment.</i>
