### Synonyms of "Flabbergasted" as an adjective (6 Words)

	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise.
<b><u>dumbfounded</u></b>	<i>A circle of policemen stood <b>dumbfounded</b> by her denial of having seen the accident.</i>
<b>dumbstricken</b>	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise.
<b>dumbstruck</b>	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise. <i>He was <b>dumbstruck</b> with terror.</i>
<b>dumfounded</b>	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise.
<b>stupefied</b>	In a state of mental numbness especially as resulting from shock. <i>Lay semiconscious stunned or <b>stupefied</b> by the blow.</i>
<b>thunderstruck</b>	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise. <i>Was <b>thunderstruck</b> by the news of his promotion.</i>

- *This news has left me totally flabbergasted.*
- *The flabbergasted aldermen were speechless.*

<b><u>astounding</u></b>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>An <b>astounding</b> achievement.</i>
<b>awesome</b>	Extremely well; excellently. <i>The <b>awesome</b> power of the atomic bomb.</i>
<b><u>daze</u></b>	A state of stunned confusion or bewilderment. <i>He was walking around in a <b>daze</b>.</i>
<b>incredible</b>	Very good; wonderful. <i>An almost <b>incredible</b> tale of triumph and tragedy.</i>
<b><u>marvelous</u></b>	Being or having the character of a miracle. <i>A <b>marvelous</b> collection of rare books.</i>
<b>prodigious</b>	So great in size or force or extent as to elicit awe. <i>The stove consumed a <b>prodigious</b> amount of fuel.</i>
<b><u>puzzled</u></b>	Filled with bewilderment. <i>She looked <b>puzzled</b> and angry with him.</i>

<b>redoubtable</b>	Worthy of respect or honor. <i>The <b>redoubtable</b> ladies.</i>
<b>serendipity</b>	Good luck in making unexpected and fortunate discoveries. <i>A fortunate stroke of <b>serendipity</b>.</i>
<u><b>shattered</b></u>	Exhausted. <i>I usually feel too <b>shattered</b> to do more than crawl into bed.</i>
<b>shock</b>	Subject to electrical shocks. <i>She was <b>shocked</b> at the state of his injuries.</i>
<u><b>shocked</b></u>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
<u><b>shocking</b></u>	Glaringly vivid and graphic; marked by sensationalism. <i><b>Shocking</b> behaviour.</i>
<u><b>staggering</b></u>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>The amount of money required was <b>staggering</b>.</i>
<u><b>startle</b></u>	Move or jump suddenly, as if in surprise or alarm. <i>A sudden sound in the doorway <b>startled</b> her.</i>
<b>stun</b>	Hit something or somebody as if with a sandbag. <i><b>Stun</b> fish.</i>
<b>stupefy</b>	Make (someone) unable to think or feel properly. <i>The offence of administering drugs to a woman with intent to <b>stupefy</b> her.</i>
<b>surprise</b>	Cause to be surprised. <i><b>Surprise</b> major.</i>
<b>surprised</b>	Taken unawares or suddenly and feeling wonder or astonishment. <i><b>Surprised</b> by her student s ingenuity.</i>
<u><b>surprising</b></u>	Causing surprise; unexpected. <i>A <b>surprising</b> sequence of events.</i>
<b>unexpectedly</b>	Without advance planning. <i>Tourist chiefs reported <b>unexpectedly</b> high visitor numbers.</i>
<b>wonderful</b>	Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. <i>They all think she s <b>wonderful</b>.</i>
<u><b>wondering</b></u>	Showing curiosity. <i>Peter listened with an air of <b>wondering</b> astonishment.</i>
