dumbstricken As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise.

dumfounded As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise.

stupefiedIn a state of mental numbness especially as resulting from shock.

Lay semiconscious stunned or **stupefied** by the blow.

thunderstruck As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise.

Was **thunderstruck** by the news of his promotion.

The **redoubtable** ladies.

Good luck in making unexpected and fortunate discoveries. serendipity

A fortunate stroke of **serendipity**.

Exhausted.

Subject to electrical shocks. shock

She was **shock**ed at the state of his injuries.

shocked Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.

Glaringly vivid and graphic; marked by sensationalism. **shocking**

Shocking behaviour.

So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. **staggering**

The amount of money required was **staggering**.

Move or jump suddenly, as if in surprise or alarm. **startle**

A sudden sound in the doorway **startle**d her.

Hit something or somebody as if with a sandbag. stun

Stun fish.

Make (someone) unable to think or feel properly. stupefy

The offence of administering drugs to a woman with intent to **stupefy** her.

Cause to be surprised.

surprise Surprise major.

Taken unawares or suddenly and feeling wonder or astonishment. surprised

Surprised by her student s ingenuity.

Causing surprise; unexpected. surprising

A **surprising** sequence of events.

Without advance planning.

unexpectedly Tourist chiefs reported unexpectedly high visitor numbers.

Extraordinarily good or great; used especially as intensifiers. wonderful

They all think she s wonderful.
