


Flake as a Verb

- Lose small fragments from the surface.
- Fail to keep an appointment or fulfil a commitment, especially with little or no advance notice.
- Come off in flakes or thin small pieces.
- (of food) come apart in flakes or thin pieces.
- Form into flakes.
- Cover with flakes or as if with flakes.
- Come or fall away from a surface in flakes.
- Separate (food) into flakes or thin pieces.
