### Definitions of "Flashy" as an adjective

- *(used especially of clothes) marked by conspicuous display.*
- *Tastelessly showy.*
- *Marked by conspicuous display.*



## Synonyms of "Flashy" as an adjective (23 Words)

<b>bold</b>	(of a person or their manner) so confident as to be impudent or presumptuous. <i>A <b>bold</b> attempt to solve the crisis.</i>
<b>brassy</b>	Sounding like a brass musical instrument; harsh and loud. <i>Her <b>brassy</b> audacious exterior.</i>
<b>cheap</b>	Of little worth because achieved in a discreditable way requiring little effort. <i><b>Cheap</b> shoddy goods.</i>
<u><a href="#">conspicuous</a></u>	Without any attempt at concealment; completely obvious. <i>He showed <b>conspicuous</b> bravery.</i>
<u><a href="#">expensive</a></u>	High in price or charging high prices. <i>Keeping a horse is <b>expensive</b>.</i>
<b>extravagant</b>	Unrestrained, especially with regard to feelings. <i><b>Extravagant</b> praise.</i>
<b>flamboyant</b>	(of a person or their behaviour) tending to attract attention because of their exuberance, confidence, and stylishness. <i>The band s <b>flamboyant</b> lead singer.</i>
<b>flash</b>	Relating to the language used by criminals or prostitutes. <i>A <b>flash</b> new car.</i>
<b>garish</b>	Obtrusively bright and showy; lurid. <i><b>Garish</b> colors.</i>
<u><a href="#">gaudy</a></u>	Extravagantly bright or showy, typically so as to be tasteless. <i>A <b>gaudy</b> costume.</i>
<b>gimcrack</b>	Showy but cheap or badly made. <i>Plastic <b>gimcrack</b> cookware.</i>
<b>jazzy</b>	Of, resembling, or in the style of jazz. <i>A <b>jazzy</b> piano solo.</i>
<b>loud</b>	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music loud with force. <i><b>Loud</b> trombones.</i>
<b>meretricious</b>	Like or relating to a prostitute. <i>A <b>meretricious</b> argument.</i>
<b>obtrusive</b>	Undesirably noticeable. <i>The <b>obtrusive</b> behavior of a spoiled child.</i>
<u><a href="#">ostentatious</a></u>	Intended to attract notice and impress others. <i>A simple design that is glamorous without being <b>ostentatious</b>.</i>

- pretentious** Making claim to or creating an appearance of (often undeserved) importance or distinction.  
*A **pretentious** fraud.*
- showy** Superficially attractive and stylish; suggesting wealth or expense.  
***Showy** flowers.*
- sporty** (used especially of clothes) marked by conspicuous display.  
*Tracksuits don't necessarily mean you're **sporty**.*
- tacky** (of glue, paint, or other substances) not fully dry and retaining a slightly sticky feel.  
*The paint was still **tacky**.*
- tatty** Worn and shabby; in poor condition.  
*An old house with dirty windows and **tatty** curtains.*



## Usage Examples of "Flashy" as an adjective

- *A **flashy** ring.*
- *He always had a **flashy** car.*
