
Flashy as an Adjective

Definitions of "Flashy" as an adjective

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "flashy" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Ostentatiously attractive or impressive.
- (used especially of clothes) marked by conspicuous display.
- *Tastelessly showy.*
- Marked by conspicuous display.







Synonyms of "Flashy" as an adjective (23 Words)

(of a person or their manner) so confident as to be impudent or

bold presumptuous.

A **bold** attempt to solve the crisis.

Sounding like a brass musical instrument; harsh and loud. brassy

Her **brassy** audacious exterior.

Of little worth because achieved in a discreditable way requiring little effort. cheap

Cheap shoddy goods.

Without any attempt at concealment; completely obvious. **conspicuous**

He showed conspicuous bravery.

High in price or charging high prices.

expensive *Keeping a horse is* **expensive**.

Unrestrained, especially with regard to feelings.

extravagant **Extravagant** praise.

(of a person or their behaviour) tending to attract attention because of their

exuberance, confidence, and stylishness. flamboyant

The band s **flamboyant** lead singer.

Relating to the language used by criminals or prostitutes. flash

A **flash** new car.

Obtrusively bright and showy; lurid. garish

Garish colors.

Extravagantly bright or showy, typically so as to be tasteless.

gaudy A **gaudy** costume.

Showy but cheap or badly made. gimcrack

Plastic **qimcrack** cookware.

Of, resembling, or in the style of jazz.

jazzy

A **jazzy** piano solo.

Used chiefly as a direction or description in music loud with force. loud

Loud trombones.

meretricious Like or relating to a prostitute.

A meretricious argument.

Undesirably noticeable. obtrusive

The **obtrusive** behavior of a spoiled child.

Intended to attract notice and impress others.

ostentatious A simple design that is glamorous without being **ostentatious**.



Making claim to or creating an appearance of (often undeserved)

pretentious importance or distinction.

A pretentious fraud.

showy Superficially attractive and stylish; suggesting wealth or expense.

Showy flowers.

sporty (used especially of clothes) marked by conspicuous display.

Tracksuits don t necessarily mean you re **sporty**.

(of glue, paint, or other substances) not fully dry and retaining a slightly

tacky sticky feel.

The paint was still tacky.

tatty Worn and shabby; in poor condition.

An old house with dirty windows and tatty curtains.



Usage Examples of "Flashy" as an adjective

- A flashy ring.
- He always had a flashy car.
