<b>flavour</b>	A substance used to alter or enhance the taste of food or drink a flavouring. <i>The yoghurt comes in eight fruit <b>flavours</b>.</i>
<b>fragrant</b>	Pleasant-smelling. <i>She gathered the <b>fragrant</b> blooms.</i>
<b>luscious</b>	(of food or drink) having a pleasingly rich, sweet taste. <i>A <b>luscious</b> and fragrant dessert wine.</i>
<b>meal</b>	The food eaten during a meal. <i>A bar serving light <b>meals</b>.</i>
<b>nip</b>	A small sharp bite or snip. <i>The Queen s corgis always <b>nip</b> at her staff s ankles.</i>
<b>palatable</b>	(of an action or proposal) acceptable or satisfactory. <i><b>Palatable</b> food.</i>
<b>piquancy</b>	A tart spicy quality. <i>The tragedy only adds <b>piquancy</b> to the tale.</i>
<b>repast</b>	The food served and eaten at one time. <i>A sumptuous <b>repast</b>.</i>

<b>savor</b>	Derive or receive pleasure from; get enjoyment from; take pleasure in. <i>Savor the soup.</i>
<b>savory</b>	An aromatic or spicy dish served at the end of dinner or as an hors d'oeuvre. <i>A past that was scarcely <b>savory</b>.</i>
<b>savour</b>	The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. <i>Their genuflections <b>savoured</b> of superstition and popery.</i>
<b>sour</b>	Make sour or more sour. <i>The kitchen smelled of <b>sour</b> milk.</i>
<b>spicy</b>	Flavoured with or fragrant with spice. <i>A <b>spicy</b> sauce.</i>
<b>sweet</b>	The sweet part or element of something. <i>The <b>sweet</b> handling of this motorcycle.</i>
<b>tang</b>	A common rockweed used in preparing kelp and as manure. <i>A full <b>tang</b> is used for strength.</i>
<b>tangy</b>	Having a strong, piquant flavour or smell. <i>A <b>tangy</b> salad.</i>
<b>taste</b>	Have flavor taste of something. <i>He got a <b>taste</b> of life on the wild side.</i>
<b>tasty</b>	(of food) having a pleasant, distinct flavour. <i>A <b>tasty</b> snack.</i>
<b>zesty</b>	Having an agreeably pungent taste.
