<b>perfume</b>	Impregnate with perfume or a sweet smelling substance. Her hair was oiled and <b>perfumed</b> .
<b>pudding</b>	A cooked sweet dish served after the main course of a meal. A rice <b>pudding</b> .

<b>redolent</b>	Serving to bring to mind. <i>A campaign <b>redolent</b> of machine politics.</i>
<b>saccharine</b>	Overly sweet. <i><b>Saccharine</b> music.</i>
<b>savor</b>	Taste appreciatively. <i><b>Savor</b> the soup.</i>
<b>savory</b>	Any of several aromatic herbs or subshrubs of the genus <i>Satureja</i> having spikes of flowers attractive to bees. <i>A past that was scarcely <b>savory</b>.</i>
<b>scent</b>	Catch the scent of get wind of. <i>The bull advanced <b>scenting</b> the breeze at every step.</i>
<b>smell</b>	A quality in something that is perceived by the faculty of smell an odour or scent. <i>Lingering kitchen <b>smells</b>.</i>
<b>sweet</b>	With sweetening added. <i>Hello my <b>sweet</b>.</i>
<b>taste</b>	Have a distinctive or characteristic taste. <i>The waiter poured some wine for him to <b>taste</b>.</i>
