saccharine	Overly sweet. <i>Saccharine music.</i>
savor	Taste appreciatively. <i>Savor the soup.</i>
savory	Any of several aromatic herbs or subshrubs of the genus <i>Satureja</i> having spikes of flowers attractive to bees. <i>A past that was scarcely savory.</i>
scent	Catch the scent of get wind of. <i>The bull advanced scenting the breeze at every step.</i>
smell	A quality in something that is perceived by the faculty of smell an odour or scent. <i>Lingering kitchen smells.</i>
sweet	With sweetening added. <i>Hello my sweet.</i>
taste	Have a distinctive or characteristic taste. <i>The waiter poured some wine for him to taste.</i>
