luscious	Appealing strongly to the senses; pleasingly rich. <i>A luscious and fragrant dessert wine.</i>
meal	The food eaten during a meal. <i>The evening meal.</i>
nip	A small sharp bite or snip. <i>His teeth nipped at her ear.</i>
palatable	(of an action or proposal) acceptable or satisfactory. <i>A device that made increased taxation more palatable.</i>
piquancy	The quality of being pleasantly stimulating or exciting; interest. <i>The tangy soy dip gave them a slightly Asian piquancy.</i>
repast	A meal. <i>A sumptuous repast.</i>
savor	Taste appreciatively. <i>Savor the soup.</i>
savory	Having an agreeably pungent taste. <i>A past that was scarcely savory.</i>
savour	The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. <i>The subtle savour of wood smoke.</i>
sour	Make sour or more sour. <i>A false or sour note.</i>
spicy	Suggestive of sexual impropriety. <i>I like my chili extra spicy.</i>
sweet	In an affectionate or loving manner sweet is sometimes a poetic or informal variant of sweetly. <i>Go to thy rest sweet sir.</i>
tang	Any of various coarse seaweeds. <i>The clean salty tang of the sea.</i>

- tasty** Pleasing to the sense of taste.
