<b>smell</b>	A quality in something that is perceived by the faculty of smell an odour or scent. <i>She loved the <b>smell</b> of roses.</i>

<b>flavour</b>	A substance used to alter or enhance the taste of food or drink a flavouring. <i>Various <b>flavours</b> of firewall are evolving.</i>
<b>fragrant</b>	Having a pleasant or sweet smell. <i>She gathered the <b>fragrant</b> blooms.</i>
<b>luscious</b>	Appealing strongly to the senses; pleasingly rich. <i>A <b>luscious</b> and fragrant dessert wine.</i>
<b>meal</b>	The food eaten during a meal. <i>The evening <b>meal</b>.</i>
<b>nip</b>	A small sharp bite or snip. <i>His teeth <b>nipped</b> at her ear.</i>
<b>palatable</b>	(of an action or proposal) acceptable or satisfactory. <i>A device that made increased taxation more <b>palatable</b>.</i>
<b>piquancy</b>	The quality of being pleasantly stimulating or exciting; interest. <i>The tangy soy dip gave them a slightly Asian <b>piquancy</b>.</i>
<b>repast</b>	A meal. <i>A sumptuous <b>repast</b>.</i>
<b>savor</b>	Taste appreciatively. <i><b>Savor</b> the soup.</i>
<b>savory</b>	Having an agreeably pungent taste. <i>A past that was scarcely <b>savory</b>.</i>
<b>savour</b>	The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. <i>The subtle <b>savour</b> of wood smoke.</i>
<b>sour</b>	Make sour or more sour. <i>A false or <b>sour</b> note.</i>
<b>spicy</b>	Suggestive of sexual impropriety. <i>I like my chili extra <b>spicy</b>.</i>
<b>sweet</b>	In an affectionate or loving manner sweet is sometimes a poetic or informal variant of sweetly. <i>Go to thy rest <b>sweet</b> sir.</i>
<b>tang</b>	Any of various coarse seaweeds. <i>The clean salty <b>tang</b> of the sea.</i>
