## Synonyms of "Flawless" as an adjective (5 Words)

### perfect

Of a tense denoting a completed action or a state or habitual action which began in the past The perfect tense is formed in English with have or has and the past participle as in they have eaten and they have been eating present perfect they had eaten past perfect and they will have eaten future perfect.

### unblemished

Free from physical or moral spots or stains.

An **unblemished** complexion.

### unflawed

Without a flaw.

Her **unflawed** skin.

### unimpaired

Not damaged or diminished in any respect.

**Unimpaired** mobility.



**unmarked** (of a word or other linguistic unit) having a more general meaning or use than a corresponding marked term.  
***Unmarked*** cards.

<b>blameless</b>	Free of guilt; not subject to blame. <i>He led a <b>blameless</b> life.</i>
<b>clean</b>	An act of cleaning something. <i><b>Clean</b> fresh natural flavours.</i>
<u><b>doubtless</b></u>	Certainly; without doubt. <i>The company would <b>doubtless</b> find the reduced competition to their liking.</i>
<b>guiltless</b>	Having no guilt; innocent. <i>People are forever criticizing the service and I am not myself <b>guiltless</b> in this.</i>
<u><b>harmless</b></u>	Not able or likely to cause harm. <i><b>Harmless</b> bacteria.</i>
<u><b>immaculate</b></u>	(in the Roman Catholic Church) free from sin. <i>Timing and technique were <b>immaculate</b>.</i>
<b>impeccable</b>	Not liable to sin. <i>He had <b>impeccable</b> manners.</i>
<b>innocence</b>	Lack of guile or corruption; purity. <i>The healthy bloom in her cheeks gave her an aura of <b>innocence</b>.</i>
<b>innocent</b>	A person involved by chance in a situation, especially a victim of crime or war. <i>The prisoners were later found <b>innocent</b>.</i>
<b>innocuous</b>	Lacking intent or capacity to injure. <i>It was an <b>innocuous</b> question.</i>
<u><b>irreproachable</b></u>	Free of guilt; not subject to blame. <i>His private life was <b>irreproachable</b>.</i>
<u><b>perfection</b></u>	The act of making something perfect. <i>Among the key tasks was the <b>perfection</b> of new mechanisms of economic management.</i>
<u><b>pristine</b></u>	In its original condition; unspoilt. <i><b>Pristine</b> mountain snow.</i>
<u><b>pure</b></u>	Being chromatically pure not diluted with white or grey or black. <i>These small cymbals produce a quiet but high pitched and very <b>pure</b> note.</i>
<b>purist</b>	An adherent of Purism. <i><b>Purist</b> fans of the original comic strip.</i>

<u><b>purity</b></u>	A woman's virtue or chastity. <i>The <b>purity</b> of our drinking water.</i>
<u><b>sheer</b></u>	Cause to sheer. <i>She giggled with <b>sheer</b> delight.</i>
<b>sinless</b>	Free from sin. <i>The <b>sinless</b> life of Christ.</i>
<u><b>spotless</b></u>	Absolutely clean or pure; immaculate. <i><b>Spotless</b> behaviour is seemingly the norm in his organization.</i>
<b>unblemished</b>	Not damaged or marked in any way. <i>An <b>unblemished</b> record.</i>
<b>uncontaminated</b>	Free from admixture with noxious elements; clean. <i><b>Uncontaminated</b> air and food.</i>
<b>unexceptionable</b>	Not open to objection, but not particularly new or exciting. <i>The <b>unexceptionable</b> belief that society should be governed by law.</i>
<b>unimpeachable</b>	Not able to be doubted, questioned, or criticized; entirely trustworthy. <i>An <b>unimpeachable</b> reputation.</i>
<b>unmixed</b>	Not constituting a compound. <i>Not an <b>unmixed</b> blessing.</i>
<b>unpolluted</b>	Not defiled or corrupted. <i>Her mind remains <b>unpolluted</b> by the filth they teach her.</i>
<b>unspotted</b>	Unnoticed. <i>It has an <b>unspotted</b> white throat.</i>
<b>unstained</b>	Free from blemishes. <i>His <b>unstained</b> jeans.</i>
<b>unsullied</b>	Not spoiled or made impure. <i>His <b>unsullied</b> name.</i>
<u><b>untainted</b></u>	Not contaminated, polluted, or tainted. <i>The island remains virtually <b>untainted</b> by commercialism.</i>
<u><b>virtuous</b></u>	Chaste (typically used of a woman). <i>She considered herself very <b>virtuous</b> because she neither drank nor smoked.</i>
