## Associations of "Fled" (30 Words)

<b>apophasis</b>	Mentioning something by saying it will not be mentioned.
<b><a href="#">asylum</a></b>	A shelter from danger or hardship. <i>We provide <b>asylum</b> for those too ill to care for themselves.</i>
<b>avoid</b>	Contrive not to meet (someone). <i>This route <b>avoids</b> downtown Boston.</i>
<b><a href="#">bypass</a></b>	An alternative channel created during a bypass operation. <i>You cannot <b>bypass</b> these rules.</i>
<b>circumvent</b>	Deceive; outwit. <i>He s <b>circumvented</b> her with some of his stories.</i>
<b><a href="#">deflect</a></b>	(of an object) change direction after hitting something. <i>He attempted to <b>deflect</b> attention away from his private life.</i>
<b>deviant</b>	A deviant person or thing. <i><b>Deviant</b> ideas.</i>
<b><a href="#">dodge</a></b>	An elaborate or deceitful scheme contrived to deceive or evade. <i>The child <b>dodged</b> the teacher s blow.</i>
<b>elude</b>	(of an achievement or something desired) fail to be attained by (someone). <i>What you are seeing in him <b>eludes</b> me.</i>
<b>emigration</b>	The act of leaving one’s own country to settle permanently in another; moving abroad. <i>Mass <b>emigration</b> from Ireland to the United States.</i>
<b>escape</b>	Escape potentially unpleasant consequences get away with a forbidden action. <i>They installed a second hatch as an <b>escape</b>.</i>
<b>escaped</b>	Having escaped especially from confinement. <i>Searching for two <b>escaped</b> prisoners.</i>
<b>eschew</b>	Deliberately avoid using; abstain from. <i>He appealed to the crowd to <b>eschew</b> violence.</i>

<b>evade</b>	Escape paying (tax or duty), especially by illegitimate presentation of one's finances. <i>She was sentenced on three counts of conspiracy to <b>evade</b> taxes.</i>
<b>exodus</b>	The departure of the Israelites from Egypt. <i>The annual <b>exodus</b> of sun seeking Canadians to Florida.</i>
<b>haven</b>	A shelter serving as a place of safety or sanctuary. <i>A <b>haven</b> for wildlife.</i>
<b>horrified</b>	Stricken with horror. <i>The <b>horrified</b> spectators.</i>
<b>influx</b>	An inflow of water into a river, lake, or the sea. <i>The lakes are fed by <b>influxes</b> of meltwater.</i>
<b>migrant</b>	A person who moves from one place to another, especially in order to find work or better living conditions. <i>Appalled by the social conditions of <b>migrant</b> life.</i>
<b>ostracize</b>	(in ancient Greece) banish (an unpopular or overly powerful citizen) from a city for five or ten years by popular vote. <i>Themistocles was indeed out of favour at Athens by the end of the 470s when he was <b>ostracized</b>.</i>
<b>parry</b>	An act of parrying something. <i>Her question met with a polite <b>parry</b>.</i>
<b>persecution</b>	Persistent annoyance or harassment. <i>His <b>persecution</b> at the hands of other students.</i>
<b>refugee</b>	A person who has been forced to leave their country in order to escape war, persecution, or natural disaster. <i>A <b>refugee</b> camp.</i>
<b>run</b>	An enclosed area in which domestic animals or birds may run freely in the open. <i>A small river <b>runs</b> into the sea at one side of the castle.</i>
<b>sanctuary</b>	The part of the chancel of a church containing the high altar. <i>She thought of her room as a <b>sanctuary</b>.</i>
<b>shambles</b>	A building where animals are butchered. <i>The <b>shambles</b> where the animals were slaughtered.</i>
<b>shun</b>	Expel from a community or group. <i>He <b>shunned</b> fashionable society.</i>
<b>sidestep</b>	A step taken sideways, typically to avoid someone or something. <i>He neatly <b>sidestepped</b> the questions about riots.</i>
<b>undiagnosed</b>	Not diagnosed or having been subject to diagnosis. <i><b>Undiagnosed</b> disease.</i>

Turn sharply; change direction abruptly.
