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Associations of "Fled" (30 Words)

apophasis	Mentioning something by saying it will not be mentioned.
<u>asylum</u>	A shelter from danger or hardship. <i>We provide asylum for those too ill to care for themselves.</i>
avoid	Contrive not to meet (someone). <i>This route avoids downtown Boston.</i>
<u>bypass</u>	An alternative channel created during a bypass operation. <i>You cannot bypass these rules.</i>
circumvent	Deceive; outwit. <i>He s circumvented her with some of his stories.</i>
<u>deflect</u>	(of an object) change direction after hitting something. <i>He attempted to deflect attention away from his private life.</i>
deviant	A deviant person or thing. <i>Deviant ideas.</i>
<u>dodge</u>	An elaborate or deceitful scheme contrived to deceive or evade. <i>The child dodged the teacher s blow.</i>
elude	(of an achievement or something desired) fail to be attained by (someone). <i>What you are seeing in him eludes me.</i>
emigration	The act of leaving one’s own country to settle permanently in another; moving abroad. <i>Mass emigration from Ireland to the United States.</i>
escape	Escape potentially unpleasant consequences get away with a forbidden action. <i>They installed a second hatch as an escape.</i>
escaped	Having escaped especially from confinement. <i>Searching for two escaped prisoners.</i>
eschew	Deliberately avoid using; abstain from. <i>He appealed to the crowd to eschew violence.</i>

evade	Escape paying (tax or duty), especially by illegitimate presentation of one's finances. <i>She was sentenced on three counts of conspiracy to evade taxes.</i>
exodus	The departure of the Israelites from Egypt. <i>The annual exodus of sun seeking Canadians to Florida.</i>
haven	A shelter serving as a place of safety or sanctuary. <i>A haven for wildlife.</i>
horrified	Stricken with horror. <i>The horrified spectators.</i>
influx	An inflow of water into a river, lake, or the sea. <i>The lakes are fed by influxes of meltwater.</i>
migrant	A person who moves from one place to another, especially in order to find work or better living conditions. <i>Appalled by the social conditions of migrant life.</i>
ostracize	(in ancient Greece) banish (an unpopular or overly powerful citizen) from a city for five or ten years by popular vote. <i>Themistocles was indeed out of favour at Athens by the end of the 470s when he was ostracized.</i>
parry	An act of parrying something. <i>Her question met with a polite parry.</i>
persecution	Persistent annoyance or harassment. <i>His persecution at the hands of other students.</i>
refugee	A person who has been forced to leave their country in order to escape war, persecution, or natural disaster. <i>A refugee camp.</i>
run	An enclosed area in which domestic animals or birds may run freely in the open. <i>A small river runs into the sea at one side of the castle.</i>
sanctuary	The part of the chancel of a church containing the high altar. <i>She thought of her room as a sanctuary.</i>
shambles	A building where animals are butchered. <i>The shambles where the animals were slaughtered.</i>
shun	Expel from a community or group. <i>He shunned fashionable society.</i>
sidestep	A step taken sideways, typically to avoid someone or something. <i>He neatly sidestepped the questions about riots.</i>
undiagnosed	Not diagnosed or having been subject to diagnosis. <i>Undiagnosed disease.</i>

veer

Turn sharply; change direction abruptly.
*The wind **veered** a point.*
