apophasis	Mentioning something by saying it will not be mentioned.
<u>asylum</u>	A shelter from danger or hardship. We provide asylum for those too ill to care for themselves.
avoid	Contrive not to meet (someone. This route avoid s downtown Boston.
<u>bypass</u>	An alternative channel created during a bypass operation. <i>You cannot bypass these rules.</i>
circumvent	Deceive; outwit. He s circumvent ed her with some of his stories.
<u>deflect</u>	(of an object) change direction after hitting something. <i>He attempted to deflect attention away from his private life.</i>
deviant	A deviant person or thing. Deviant ideas.
<u>dodge</u>	An elaborate or deceitful scheme contrived to deceive or evade. <i>The child dodged the teacher s blow.</i>
elude	(of an achievement or something desired) fail to be attained by (someone. <i>What you are seeing in him eludes me.</i>
emigration	The act of leaving one's own country to settle permanently in another; moving abroad. <i>Mass emigration from Ireland to the United States.</i>
escape	Escape potentially unpleasant consequences get away with a forbidden action. They installed a second hatch as an escape .
escaped	Having escaped especially from confinement. Searching for two escaped prisoners.
eschew	Deliberately avoid using; abstain from. <i>He appealed to the crowd to eschew violence.</i>



<u>evade</u>	Escape paying (tax or duty), especially by illegitimate presentation of one's finances. She was sentenced on three counts of conspiracy to evade taxes.
<u>exodus</u>	The departure of the Israelites from Egypt. The annual exodus of sun seeking Canadians to Florida.
<u>haven</u>	A shelter serving as a place of safety or sanctuary. A haven for wildlife.
horrified	Stricken with horror. <i>The horrified spectators.</i>
<u>influx</u>	An inflow of water into a river, lake, or the sea. The lakes are fed by influx es of meltwater.
migrant	A person who moves from one place to another, especially in order to find work or better living conditions. <i>Appalled by the social conditions of migrant life.</i>
<u>ostracize</u>	(in ancient Greece) banish (an unpopular or overly powerful citizen) from a city for five or ten years by popular vote. <i>Themistocles was indeed out of favour at Athens by the end of the 470s</i> <i>when he was</i> ostracize d.
parry	An act of parrying something. <i>Her question met with a polite parry.</i>
persecution	Persistent annoyance or harassment. His persecution at the hands of other students.
refugee	A person who has been forced to leave their country in order to escape war, persecution, or natural disaster. A refugee camp.
run	An enclosed area in which domestic animals or birds may run freely in the open. A small river run s into the sea at one side of the castle.
<u>sanctuary</u>	The part of the chancel of a church containing the high altar. She thought of her room as a sanctuary .
shambles	A building where animals are butchered. The shambles where the animals were slaughtered.
<u>shun</u>	Expel from a community or group. <i>He shunned fashionable society.</i>
sidestep	A step taken sideways, typically to avoid someone or something. <i>He neatly sidestepped the questions about riots.</i>
undiagnosed	Not diagnosed or having been subject to diagnosis. Undiagnosed disease.

Turn sharply; change direction abruptly. The wind **veer**ed a point.
