<b>human nature</b>	Any living or extinct member of the family Hominidae characterized by superior intelligence, articulate speech, and erect carriage.
<b>marrow</b>	Very tender and very nutritious tissue from marrowbones. <i><b>Marrow</b> donors.</i>
<b>material body</b>	The tangible substance that goes into the makeup of a physical object.
<b><u>meat</u></b>	The chief part of something. <i>Place <b>meat</b> and poultry in the refrigerator immediately.</i>
<b><u>muscle</u></b>	A muscle or muscles when well developed or prominently visible under the skin. <i>The drug lord had his <b>muscleman</b> to protect him.</i>

<b>chunk</b>	Group or chunk together in a certain order or place side by side. <i><b>Chunk</b> four pounds of pears.</i>
<b>ham</b>	(Old Testament) son of Noah. <i>Thin slices of <b>ham</b>.</i>
<b>hamburger</b>	A sandwich consisting of a fried cake of minced beef served on a bun, often with other ingredients.
<b>juicy</b>	Lucrative. <i>A <b>juicy</b> apple.</i>
<b>lamb</b>	Of a ewe give birth to lambs. <i>The poor <b>lamb</b> is very upset.</i>
<b>loaf</b>	An item of food formed into an oblong shape and sliced into portions. <i>Meat <b>loaf</b>.</i>

<b>putrescent</b>	Undergoing the process of decay; rotting. <i>The odour of <b>putrescent</b> flesh.</i>
<b>raw</b>	(of an emotion or quality) strong and undisguised. <i>A <b>raw</b> deal.</i>

<b>reindeer</b>	A deer of the tundra and subarctic regions of Eurasia and North America both sexes of which have large branching antlers Most Eurasian reindeer are domesticated and used for drawing sledges and as a source of milk flesh and hide.
<b>roast</b>	An outdoor party at which meat of a particular type is roasted. <i>Carving the Sunday <b>roast</b>.</i>
<b>steak</b>	A thick slice of steak or other high quality meat or fish. <i>A plate of <b>steak</b> and chips.</i>
<b>succulent</b>	A succulent plant. <i>A <b>succulent</b> steak.</i>
<b>uncooked</b>	Not cooked; raw. <i>Frozen ready meals may be completely <b>uncooked</b>.</i>
