- afloat** Out of debt or difficulty.  
*The canoes were still **afloat**.*
- awash** Level with the surface of water so that it just washes over.  
*The city was **awash** with journalists.*
- inundated** Covered with water.  
***Inundated** farmlands.*
- overflowing** Flooding or flowing over a surface or area.  
*An **overflowing** river swamped dozens of villages.*

## Associations of "Flooded" (30 Words)

- absorb** Take in and understand fully (information, ideas, or experience).  
***Absorb** the costs for something.*
- adrift** So as to be no longer fixed in position.  
*The team are three points **adrift** of the leaders.*
- afloat** Floating in water; not sinking.  
*There are various rumours **afloat** connected with his disappearance.*
- aimless** Aimlessly drifting.  
*An **aimless** existence.*
- awash** Level with the surface of water so that it just washes over.  
*The city was **awash** with journalists.*
- damp** Damp air or atmosphere.  
*She tried to **damp** down her feelings of despair.*

<b>dampness</b>	A slight wetness. <i>The <b>dampness</b> in the air.</i>
<b>deluge</b>	Overwhelm with a flood. <i>A <b>deluge</b> of rain hit the plains.</i>
<b>drenched</b>	Abundantly covered or supplied with; often used in combination. <i>Moon <b>drenched</b> meadows.</i>
<b>floating</b>	Borne up by or suspended in a liquid. <i>A <b>floating</b> platform.</i>
<b>foggy</b>	Full of or characterized by fog. <i>A dark and <b>foggy</b> night.</i>
<b>humid</b>	Marked by a relatively high level of water vapour in the atmosphere. <i><b>Humid</b> air.</i>
<b>humidity</b>	Atmospheric moisture. <i>The temperature is seventy seven the <b>humidity</b> in the low thirties.</i>
<b>impassable</b>	Incapable of being passed. <i>The narrow channels are <b>impassable</b> to ocean going ships.</i>
<b>lowland</b>	Low level country. <i><b>Lowland</b> farming.</i>
<b>marshland</b>	Land consisting of marshes. <i>Thousands of acres of <b>marshland</b>.</i>
<b>marshy</b>	Soft and watery. <i>The <b>marshy</b> ground towards the sea.</i>
<b>moist</b>	(of a climate) rainy. <i>Her brother s eyes became <b>moist</b>.</i>
<b>moisture</b>	Water or other liquid diffused in a small quantity as vapour, within a solid, or condensed on a surface. <i>In freshly felled wood the <b>moisture</b> content varies.</i>
<b>rain</b>	Of the sky the clouds etc send down rain. <i>She <b>rained</b> blows on to him.</i>
<b>saturated</b>	Denoting fats containing a high proportion of fatty acid molecules without double bonds considered to be less healthy in the diet than unsaturated fats. <i>A <b>saturated</b> solution.</i>
<b>sink</b>	Cause to sink. <i>You can relax on the veranda as the sun <b>sinks</b> low.</i>
<b>soaked</b>	Extremely wet; saturated. <i>Rain <b>soaked</b> streets.</i>
<b>splashing</b>	The act of splashing a liquid substance on a surface.



- sponge** Soak up with a sponge.  
*He edged closer clearly intending to **sponge** money from her.*
- submerge** Completely cover or obscure.  
*The U boat had had time to **submerge**.*
- tropics** The part of the Earth's surface between the Tropic of Cancer and the Tropic of Capricorn; characterized by a hot climate.
- vapor** The process of becoming a vapor.
- water** The surface of an area of water.  
*A **water** sign.*
- wet** Wetness caused by water.  
*She said she d **wet** the tea immediately because they must be parched.*
