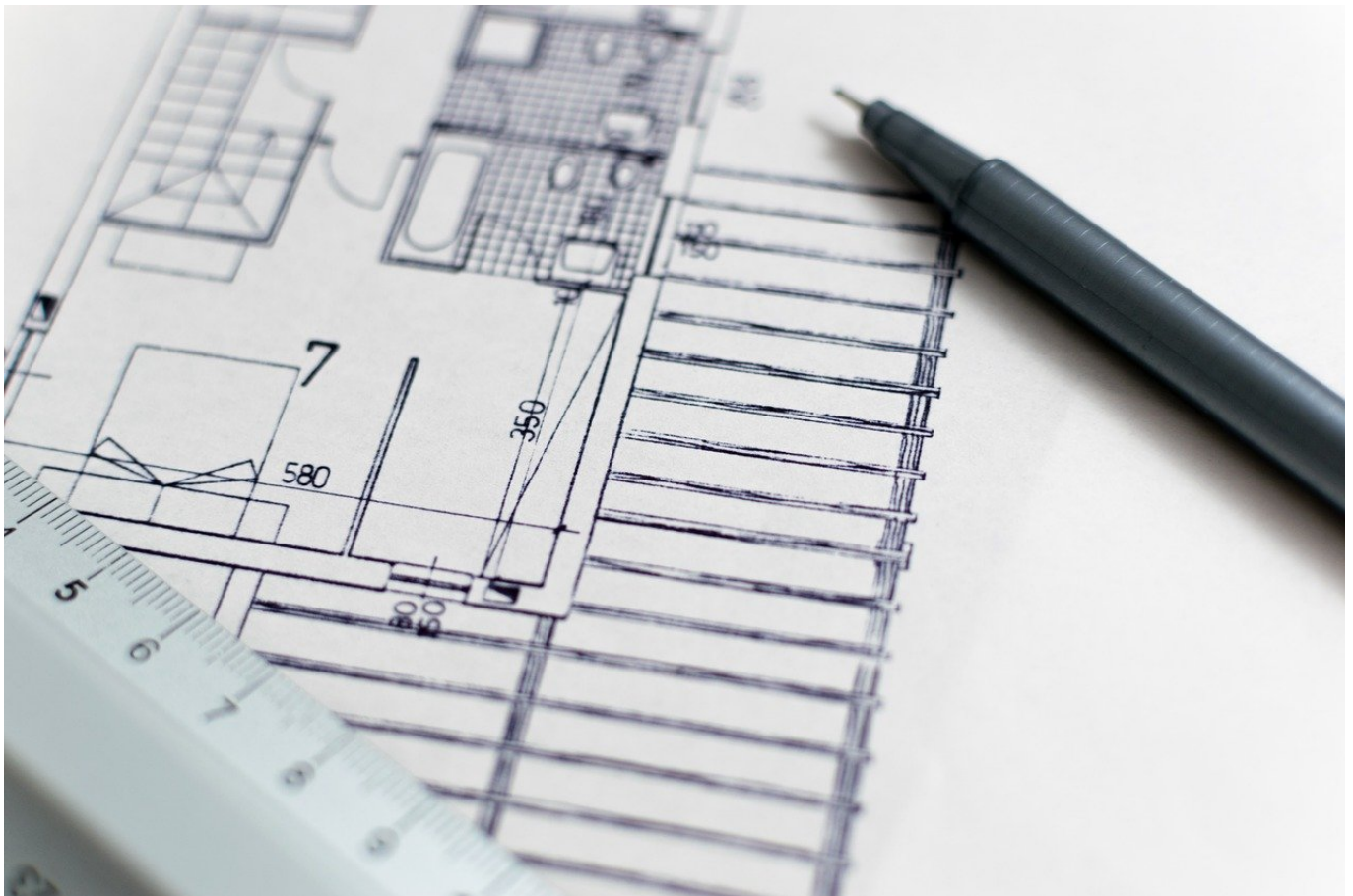
Floor as a Noun

Definitions of "Floor" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “floor” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The bottom surface of any lake or other body of water.*
- *A lower limit.*
- *The ground.*
- *A large room in a exchange where the trading is done.*
- *A minimum level of prices or wages.*
- *A structure consisting of a room or set of rooms at a single position along a vertical scale.*
- *(in a legislative assembly) the part of the house in which members sit and from which they speak.*

- *All the rooms or areas on the same level of a building; a storey.*
- *The bottom of the sea, a cave, or an area of land.*
- *The occupants of a floor.*
- *The ground on which people and animals move about.*
- *The parliamentary right to address an assembly.*
- *(in the Stock Exchange) the large central hall where trading takes place.*
- *The legislative hall where members debate and vote and conduct other business.*
- *The inside lower horizontal surface (as of a room, hallway, tent, or other structure).*
- *The lower inside surface of any hollow structure.*
- *The lower surface of a room, on which one may walk.*
- *The right or opportunity to speak next in debate.*

base

A known line used as a geometrical base for trigonometry.
*Your hotel is a good **base** from which to explore.*

deck	A floor or platform resembling or compared to a ship's deck. <i>He stood on the deck of his flagship.</i>
flooring	The inside lower horizontal surface (as of a room, hallway, tent, or other structure).
ground	Relating to actions or activities taking place on the ground rather than the air. <i>He posed her against a background of rolling hills.</i>
level	A position in a hierarchy. <i>At six he could play chess at an advanced level.</i>
storey	A structure consisting of a room or set of rooms at a single position along a vertical scale. <i>A three storey building.</i>
story	A plot or storyline. <i>I'm going to tell you a story.</i>
tier	Each in a series of rows or levels of a structure placed one above the other. <i>The sail is fastened to the yard with tiers.</i>
trading floor	Buying or selling securities or commodities.

- *Baffle (someone) completely.*
- *Knock (someone) to the ground, especially with a punch.*
- *Knock down with force.*
- *Provide (a room or area) with a floor.*
- *Surprise greatly; knock someone's socks off.*



Synonyms of "Floor" as a verb (26 Words)

baffle	Check the emission of (sound). <i>An unexplained occurrence that baffled everyone.</i>
ball over	Form into a ball by winding or rolling.
bemuse	Puzzle, confuse, or bewilder (someone). <i>He was bemused by what was happening.</i>
<u>bewilder</u>	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>His reaction had bewildered her.</i>
blow out of the water	Lay eggs.
bring down	Advance or set forth in court.

coldcock	Knock down with force.
confound	Defeat (a plan, aim, or hope). <i>We will confound these tactics by the pressure groups.</i>
confuse	Cause to feel embarrassment. <i>Purchasers might confuse the two products.</i>
deck	Be beautiful to look at. <i>Ingrid was decked out in her Sunday best.</i>
defeat	Be impossible for (someone) to understand. <i>She was defeated by the last steep hill.</i>
discomfit	Cause to lose one's composure. <i>He was not noticeably discomfited by her tone.</i>
disconcert	Cause to feel embarrassment. <i>The abrupt change of subject disconcerted her.</i>
dumbfound	Greatly astonish or amaze. <i>His efforts dumbfounded some members of the group.</i>
dump	Drop (stuff) in a heap or mass. <i>You'll get tired of me and dump me.</i>
fell	Sew a seam by folding the edges.
knock down	Rap with the knuckles.
knock over	Sound like a car engine that is firing too early.
mystify	Make obscure or mysterious. <i>Mystify the story.</i>
nonplus	Surprise and confuse (someone) so much that they are unsure how to react. <i>Diane was nonplussed by such an odd question.</i>
perplex	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>They were perplexing a subject plain in itself.</i>
prostrate	Get into a prostrate position as in submission. <i>She prostrated herself with frustration.</i>
puzzle	Be uncertain about; think about without fully understanding or being able to decide. <i>We puzzled over her sudden departure.</i>
shock	Collect or gather into shocks. <i>Carriage after carriage shocked fiercely against the engine.</i>
take aback	Take by force.
throw	Throw a die out onto a flat surface. <i>Throw the lever.</i>



Usage Examples of "Floor" as a verb

- *That question floored him.*
- *I was floored when I heard that I was promoted.*
- *A room floored in yellow wood.*
- *A stone-floored building.*
- *The champion floored Close with an uppercut.*

bedspread A decorative cloth used to cover a bed when it is not in use.

blanket Cover as if with a blanket.
*Snow **blanketed** the fields.*

board The piece of equipment on which a person stands in surfing skateboarding snowboarding and certain other sports.
*Teachers talk and write on the **board**.*

carpet Cover with carpet.
***Carpet** the floors of the house.*

ceiling The maximum altitude that a particular aircraft can reach.
*The aircraft s quoted **ceiling** of 24 000 feet.*

cleanup The fourth position in the batting order (usually filled by the best batter on the team).

curtain	A raising or lowering of the curtain at the beginning or end of an act or scene. <i>A curtain of trees.</i>
downstairs	Situated downstairs. <i>The tenants live downstairs.</i>
eaves	The part of a roof that meets or overhangs the walls of a building. <i>Wild bees nest under the eaves.</i>
escalator	A moving staircase consisting of an endlessly circulating belt of steps driven by a motor, which conveys people between the floors of a public building.
felt	Change texture so as to become matted and felt like. <i>It wasn't long before we had felted the roof making it totally watertight.</i>
flannel	Trousers made of flannel or gabardine or tweed or white cloth. <i>He was dressed in a tweed jacket and grey flannels.</i>
flat	Make flat flatten. <i>Flat wall paint.</i>
hall	A large room in a mansion or palace used for receptions and banquets. <i>The village hall.</i>
laminated	Create laminate by bonding sheets of material with a bonding material. <i>The blade is suitable for cutting plastics or laminates.</i>
linoleum	A material consisting of a canvas backing thickly coated with a preparation of linseed oil and powdered cork, used especially as a floor covering.
lobby	In the UK lobby correspondents collectively. <i>A recent lobby of Parliament by pensioners.</i>
mat	A small pad of material that is used to protect surface from an object placed on it. <i>Dog hair mats more quickly than human hair.</i>
nave	The central area of a church.
oriental	A member of an Oriental race; the term is regarded as offensive by Asians (especially by Asian Americans). <i>Oriental rugs.</i>
parlor	Reception room in an inn or club where visitors can be received.
parquet	Seating on the main floor between the orchestra and the parquet circle. <i>Do not lay parquet over old vinyl flooring.</i>
roof	Provide a building with a roof cover a building with a roof. <i>The rain woke him hammering on the roof.</i>
room	A set of rooms typically rented in which a person couple or family live. <i>She made room for Josh on the sofa.</i>

- rug** A floor covering of thick woven material or animal skin, typically not extending over the entire floor.
*Men who shave their heads or wear **rugs**.*
- sheet** Come down as if in sheets.
*The rain was still falling in **sheets**.*
- slab** Remove slabs from a log or tree to prepare it for sawing into planks.
*He **slabbed** the log on the two other remaining sides to make a rectangular timber.*
- stairway** A set of steps or stairs and its surrounding walls or structure.
*A narrow stone **stairway**.*
- upholstery** The art or practice of upholstering furniture.
*Leather **upholstery**.*
- wooden** Lacking ease or grace.
*A **wooden** box.*
