
Definitions of "Floor" as a noun

- A lower limit.
- The ground.
- A large room in a exchange where the trading is done.
- A minimum level of prices or wages.
- A structure consisting of a room or set of rooms at a single position along a vertical scale.
- (in a legislative assembly) the part of the house in which members sit and from which they speak.



- All the rooms or areas on the same level of a building; a storey.
- The bottom of the sea, a cave, or an area of land.
- The occupants of a floor.
- The ground on which people and animals move about.
- The parliamentary right to address an assembly.
- (in the Stock Exchange) the large central hall where trading takes place.


Floor as a Verb
