- flush** Denoting a type of toilet that has a flushing device.

*The paper has lost millions of readers since its **heyday** in 1964.*
- peak** A brim that projects to the front to shade the eyes.  
*A slight increase in velocity provides a second **peak** on the general velocity curve.*

## Synonyms of "Flowers" as a verb (2 Words)

**bloom** Coat (a lens) with a special surface layer so as to reduce reflection from its surface.

*A chalk pit where cowslips **bloomed**.*

**blossom** Mature or develop in a promising or healthy way.

*A garden in which roses **blossom**.*



## Associations of "Flowers" (30 Words)

### [ambrosia](#)

A fungal product used as food by ambrosia beetles.  
*The tea was **ambrosia** after the slop I d been suffering.*

### **anther**

The part of a stamen that contains the pollen.

### [aroma](#)

A distinctive, typically pleasant smell.  
*The tantalizing **aroma** of fresh coffee.*

### **aster**

A radiating array of microtubules associated with a centrosome in a dividing cell.

### **bee**

An insect of a large group to which the honeybee belongs including many solitary as well as social kinds.  
*A sewing **bee**.*

### [bloom](#)

A greyish-white appearance on chocolate caused by cocoa butter rising to the surface.  
*The remastering has lost some of the **bloom** of the strings.*

<b>blossom</b>	(of a tree or bush) produce flowers or masses of flowers. <i>Tiny white <b>blossoms</b>.</i>
<b>bouquet</b>	An expression of approval; a compliment. <i>The aperitif has a faint <b>bouquet</b> of almonds.</i>
<b>bush</b>	Dense vegetation consisting of stunted trees or bushes. <i>A childish face with a <b>bush</b> of bright hair.</i>
<b>daisy</b>	Used in names of other plants of the daisy family e g Michaelmas daisy Shasta daisy.
<b>fragrance</b>	A distinctive odor that is pleasant. <i>Men who don't customarily wear <b>fragrance</b>.</i>
<b>herbaceous</b>	Denoting or relating to herbs (in the botanical sense).
<b>honey</b>	Of something having the color of honey. <i>She's a little <b>honey</b>.</i>
<b>lily</b>	Used in names of other plants with flowers or leaves similar to those of the lily e g arum lily.
<b>lotus</b>	White Egyptian lotus water lily of Egypt to southeastern Africa held sacred by the Egyptians. <i>A myth of creation states that Buddha was born of a thousand petalled gold <b>lotus</b>.</i>
<b>nectar</b>	Fruit juice especially when undiluted. <i>The cold pint at the pub was <b>nectar</b>.</i>
<b>nectary</b>	A nectar-secreting glandular organ in a flower (floral) or on a leaf or stem (extrafloral).
<b>nosegay</b>	An arrangement of flowers that is usually given as a present. <i>A <b>nosegay</b> worn at the waist or bodice.</i>
<b>orchid</b>	Any of numerous plants of the orchid family usually having flowers of unusual shapes and beautiful colors.
<b>ovule</b>	The part of the ovary of seed plants that contains the female germ cell and after fertilization becomes the seed.
<b>petal</b>	Each of the segments of the corolla of a flower, which are modified leaves and are typically coloured.
<b>plant</b>	Place a plant in the ground out of doors so it can grow especially after growing it from seed in an indoor environment. <i>The police used a <b>plant</b> to trick the thieves.</i>

<b>pollen</b>	A fine powdery substance typically yellow consisting of microscopic grains discharged from the male part of a flower or from a male cone Each grain contains a male gamete that can fertilize the female ovule to which pollen is transported by the wind insects or other animals.
<b>pollinate</b>	Convey pollen to or deposit pollen on (a stigma, ovule, flower, or plant) and so allow fertilization. <i>Large tubular bird <b>pollinated</b> flowers.</i>
<b>ragweed</b>	Any of numerous chiefly North American weedy plants constituting the genus Ambrosia that produce highly allergenic pollen responsible for much hay fever and asthma.
<a href="#"><u>rose</u></a>	A stylized representation of a rose in heraldry or decoration typically with five petals especially as a national emblem of England. <i>The <b>rose</b> and gold of dawn.</i>
<b>seed</b>	Of a plant reproduce itself by means of its own seeds. <i>He knocked the top <b>seed</b> out of the championships.</i>
<a href="#"><u>stalk</u></a>	A stalklike support for a sessile animal or for an organ in an animal. <i>Drinking glasses with long <b>stalks</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>sweet</u></a>	A sweet dish forming a course of a meal a pudding or dessert. <i>A cup of hot <b>sweet</b> tea.</i>
<b>tulip</b>	A bulbous spring-flowering plant of the lily family, with boldly coloured cup-shaped flowers.
