- *Either of the two lobes of the tail of a cetacean.*
- *Flat bladelike projection on the arm of an anchor.*

<b>a twist of fate</b>	A miniature whirlpool or whirlwind resulting when the current of a fluid doubles back on itself.
<b><a href="#">accident</a></b>	The working of fortune; chance. <i>The pregnancy was an <b>accident</b>.</i>
<b>chance</b>	The possibility of future success. <i>He played down his <b>chances</b> of becoming chairman.</i>
<b><a href="#">coincidence</a></b>	An event that might have been arranged although it was really accidental. <i>The interval determining the <b>coincidence</b> gate is adjustable.</i>
<b>flue</b>	A duct for smoke and waste gases produced by a fire, a gas heater, a power station, or other fuel-burning installation. <i><b>Flue</b> gases.</i>
<b>good fortune</b>	Articles of commerce.
<b>good luck</b>	Articles of commerce.

**trematode** A parasitic flatworm of the class Trematoda.

**trematode worm** A software program capable of reproducing itself that can spread from one computer to the next over a network.

<b>air</b>	Expose a room to the open air in order to ventilate it. <i>We cannot <b>air</b> this X rated song.</i>
<b>betray</b>	Be gravely disloyal to. <i>Her smile <b>betrayed</b> her true feelings.</i>
<b>bilk</b>	Evade payment to. <i>Some businesses <b>bilk</b> thousands of dollars from unsuspecting elderly consumers.</i>
<b>chance</b>	Be the case by chance. <i>He <b>chanced</b> upon an interesting advertisement.</i>
<b>charge</b>	File a formal charge against. <i>The teacher led her <b>charges</b> across the street.</i>
<b>chimney</b>	A chimney stack. <i>A factory <b>chimney</b>.</i>

<b>cigarette</b>	An object similar to a cigarette containing a narcotic or herbal substance.
<b>damper</b>	A pad silencing a piano string except when removed by means of a pedal or by the note being struck. <i>This will be a <b>damper</b> on the liberal agenda for the next couple of years.</i>
<b>fireplace</b>	A structure surrounding a fireplace. <i>The <b>fireplace</b> was so large you could walk inside it.</i>
<b>flue</b>	Flat blade-like projection on the arm of an anchor. <i>No air rises up the chimney usually because the <b>flue</b> is blocked.</i>
<b>gas</b>	Gas generated in the alimentary canal flatulence. <i>After <b>gassing</b> up the car he went into the restaurant.</i>
<b>hint</b>	Drop a hint intimate by a hint. <i>Handy <b>hints</b> on saving energy in your home.</i>
<b>indication</b>	A datum about some physical state that is presented to a user by a meter or similar instrument. <i>The presence of bacterial infection was an <b>indication</b> for the use of antibiotics.</i>
<b>joke</b>	Tell a joke speak humorously. <i>I regarded his campaign for mayor as a <b>joke</b>.</i>
<b>mantel</b>	A mantelpiece or mantelshelf.
<b>measurement</b>	The action of measuring something. <i>A telescope with which precise <b>measurements</b> can be made.</i>
<b>million</b>	Denoting a quantity consisting of 1,000,000 items or units. <i>There were <b>millions</b> of flies.</i>
<b>mulct</b>	Impose a fine on. <i>No government dared propose to <b>mulct</b> the taxpayer for such a purpose.</i>
<b>number</b>	Add up in number or quantity. <i>Every <b>number</b> has a unique position in the sequence.</i>
<b>pay</b>	Do or give something to somebody in return. <i>You ll <b>pay</b> for this.</i>
<b>pipe</b>	A set of musical pipes joined together as in pan pipes. <i>The hands were <b>piped</b> to breakfast.</i>
<b>scam</b>	A dishonest scheme; a fraud. <i>A guy that <b>scams</b> old pensioners out of their savings.</i>
<b>smoke</b>	Treat fumigate or cleanse by exposure to smoke. <i>His dreams all turned to <b>smoke</b>.</i>
<b>snitch</b>	Someone acting as an informer or decoy for the police. <i>She was <b>snitching</b> a look out of the window.</i>

<b>stub</b>	The part of a check that is retained as a record. <i>She <b>stubbed</b> out her cigarette in the overflowing ashtray.</i>
<b><u>ticket</u></b>	Provide with a ticket for passage or admission. <i>Companies that appeared to have a one way <b>ticket</b> to profitability.</i>
<b>tip</b>	Remove the tip from. <i>Sometimes they <b>tip</b> the arrows with poison.</i>
<b>trick</b>	An attempt to get you to do something foolish or imprudent. <i>He s a double dealer capable of any mean <b>trick</b>.</i>
<b>vent</b>	The release or expression of a strong emotion, energy, etc. <i>We <b>vent</b> our spleen on drug barons.</i>
<b>victim</b>	An unfortunate person who suffers from some adverse circumstance. <i><b>Victims</b> of domestic violence.</i>
