Associations of "Flung" (30 Words)

bin	Store in bins. <i>She was a bit weird so I binned her off.</i>
binge	Indulge in an activity, especially eating, drinking, or taking drugs, to excess. <i>The kids binged on ice cream.</i>
chuck	A throw. <i>Many would chuck it all if it was financially feasible.</i>
dart	A small pointed missile with a feather or plastic flight used in the game of darts. <i>Jack s first dart pierced the treble twenty.</i>
discard	Anything that is cast aside or discarded. <i>Hilary bundled up the clothes she had discarded.</i>
discus	A disk used in throwing competitions.
dispose	Make receptive or willing towards an action or attitude or belief. <i>The government proposed but the trade union movement disposed.</i>
dump	A heap of rubbish left at a dump. <i>These countries have been dumping cheap fertilizers on the UK market.</i>
flip	The act of flipping a coin. <i>The fish flipped over.</i>
garbage	Food that is discarded (as from a kitchen). <i>A garbage dump.</i>
hurl	Vomit. <i>Rioters hurled a brick through the windscreen.</i>
jettison	The action of jettisoning something. <i>The scheme was jettisoned.</i>
luxury	Luxurious or of the nature of a luxury. <i>They actually had the luxury of a whole day together.</i>

pebble	(of a spectacle lens) very thick and convex. <i>A narrow pebble beach.</i>
prodigality	Excessive spending.
somersault	Perform a somersault or make a similar movement accidentally. <i>Paula's stomach turned a somersault.</i>
spending	The act of spending or disbursing money.
spin	Spin dry clothes. <i>He tried to put a positive spin on the president's campaign.</i>
splurge	Spend (money) freely or extravagantly. <i>I splurged on a new TV.</i>
surplus	The excess value of a company's assets over the face value of its stock. <i>Exports of food surpluses.</i>
taxation	Government income due to taxation. <i>Direct taxation was low.</i>
throw	An illegitimate delivery considered to have been thrown rather than properly bowled. <i>A shoulder throw.</i>
toss	The action of tossing a coin as a method of deciding which team has the right to make a particular decision at the beginning of a game. <i>The toss of a coin.</i>
turn	Turning or twisting around in place. <i>She is turning 50 this year.</i>
turnover	The act of upsetting something. <i>The team were sitting on their lead and taking care to avoid turnovers.</i>
unload	Leave or unload. <i>The street was jammed with vans unloading.</i>
waste	Run off as waste. <i>It's a waste of time trying to argue with him.</i>
wastebasket	A container with an open top; for discarded paper and other rubbish.
wasteful	Inefficient in use of time and effort and materials. <i>Wasteful energy consumption.</i>
whirl	A usually brief attempt. <i>A hazelnut whirl.</i>
