Synonyms of "Flustered" as an adjective (3 Words)

hot and bothered Having or showing great eagerness or enthusiasm.

perturbed Feeling anxiety or concern; unsettled.
*She didn't seem **perturbed** about the noises around her.*

rattled Thrown into a state of agitated confusion rattled is an informal term.

addle	(of an egg) rotten. <i>Being in love must have addled your brain.</i>
baffle	A flat plate that controls or directs the flow of fluid or energy. <i>To baffle the noise further I pad the gunwales.</i>
befuddle	Make (someone) unable to think clearly. <i>This question befuddled even the teacher.</i>
bewildered	Perplexed by many conflicting situations or statements; filled with bewilderment. <i>Bewildered and confused.</i>
bicker	Argue over petty things. <i>Couples who bicker over who gets what from the divorce.</i>
blush	A pink or pale red tinge. <i>The roses were white with a lovely pink blush.</i>
bustle	Move or cause to move energetically or busily. <i>The cheerleaders bustled about excitingly before their performance.</i>
busy	Keep busy with. <i>He had been too busy to enjoy himself.</i>
confound	Defeat (a plan, aim, or hope). <i>We will confound these tactics by the pressure groups.</i>
confuse	Cause to feel embarrassment. <i>These questions confuse even the experts.</i>
discomfit	Cause to lose one's composure. <i>He was not noticeably discomfited by her tone.</i>
disconcert	Disturb the composure of; unsettle. <i>The abrupt change of subject disconcerted her.</i>
disorder	Bring disorder to. <i>They are disordering the political landscape.</i>
dither	Make a fuss; be agitated. <i>All of a dither he prophesied instant chaos.</i>
embarrassed	Made to feel uncomfortable because of shame or wounded pride. <i>Too embarrassed to say hello to his drunken father on the street.</i>
flap	The motion made by flapping up and down. <i>He pushed through the tent flap.</i>

flurry	(especially of snow or leaves) be moved in small swirling masses by sudden gusts of wind. <i>There was a flurry of chicken feathers.</i>
flutter	An act of fluttering. <i>A couple of butterflies fluttered around the garden.</i>
fuss	An excited state of agitation. <i>When she cries in her sleep try not to fuss her.</i>
hassle	An angry disturbance. <i>You want to sit and relax and not get hassled.</i>
jumble	Articles collected for a jumble sale. <i>The books were in a chaotic jumble.</i>
muddle	A confused multitude of things. <i>The finances were in a muddle.</i>
perplex	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>They were perplexing a subject plain in itself.</i>
perplexing	Completely baffling; very puzzling. <i>A perplexing problem.</i>
picky	Fussy and hard to please. <i>They are becoming increasingly picky about where they stay.</i>
quibble	An evasion of the point of an argument by raising irrelevant distinctions or objections. <i>Let s not quibble over pennies.</i>
scuffle	Disorderly fighting. <i>The drunken men started to scuffle.</i>
spat	Clap one's hands or shout after performances to indicate approval. <i>Bullets were spatting down on us.</i>
voracious	Devouring or craving food in great quantities. <i>Paying taxes to voracious governments.</i>
