## **Fodder as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Fodder" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “fodder” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Food, especially dried hay or straw, for cattle and other livestock.*
- *Coarse food (especially for livestock) composed of entire plants or the leaves and stalks of a cereal crop.*
- *Soldiers who are regarded as expendable in the face of artillery fire.*
- *A person or thing regarded only as material for a specific use.*



## Synonyms of "Fodder" as a noun (6 Words)

**cannon fodder** A large artillery gun that is usually on wheels.

**feed** An actor who gives a feed to a fellow performer.  
*A paper **feed**.*

**food** Anything that provides mental stimulus for thinking.  
*Baby **foods**.*

**foodstuff** Consumer goods sold by a grocer.  
*The people depend on sago starch as a basic **foodstuff**.*

**herbage** The right of pasture on another person's land.  
*After rain tall **herbage** invariably collapses on to the paths.*

**pasturage** Land used for pasture.  
*The human species has only engaged in **pasturage** for 12 000 to 15 000 years.*



## Usage Examples of "Fodder" as a noun

## Associations of "Fodder" (30 Words)

<b>buffalo</b>	Any of several Old World animals resembling oxen including e g water buffalo Cape buffalo. <i>The problem has <b>buffaloed</b> the advertising staff.</i>
<b>burro</b>	Small donkey used as a pack animal.
<b>camel</b>	A fabric made from camel hair. <i>A <b>camel</b> coat.</i>
<b>carnivore</b>	Any animal that feeds on flesh. <i>Terrestrial <b>carnivores</b> have four or five clawed digits on each limb.</i>
<b>cat</b>	A short tapered stick used in the game of tipcat. <i>His mother called me an old <b>cat</b>.</i>
<b>cattle</b>	Animals of a group related to domestic cattle including yak bison and buffaloes. <i>So many head of <b>cattle</b>.</i>

<b>crop</b>	Prepare for crops. <i>The parsley will need protection to continue <b>cropping</b> through the winter.</i>
<b>cultivate</b>	Raise or grow (plants), especially on a large scale for commercial purposes. <i>Damp well <b>cultivated</b> soil.</i>
<b>dairy</b>	A farm where dairy products are produced. <i>I rely on soya as a substitute for <b>dairy</b>.</i>
<b>diet</b>	Follow a regimen or a diet as for health reasons. <i><b>Diet</b> soft drinks.</i>
<b>dog</b>	A wild animal of the dog family. <i>She has <b>dogged</b> the door shut.</i>
<b>domesticate</b>	Cultivate (a plant) for food. <i>Mammals were first <b>domesticated</b> for their milk.</i>
<b>domesticated</b>	(of an animal) tame and kept as a pet or on a farm. <i>He is thoroughly <b>domesticated</b>.</i>
<b>donkey</b>	A children's card game involving exchanging cards.
<b>elephant</b>	The symbol of the Republican Party; introduced in cartoons by Thomas Nast in 1874.
<b>goat</b>	A wild mammal related to the goat such as the ibex. <i>Just for once stop acting the <b>goat</b>.</i>
<b>graze</b>	Break the skin (of a body part) by scraping. <i>Cattle <b>graze</b> on the open meadows.</i>
<b>herbivore</b>	Any animal that feeds chiefly on grass and other plants. <i>Horses are <b>herbivores</b>.</i>
<b>herd</b>	Move together like a herd. <i>A <b>herd</b> of elephants.</i>
<b>legume</b>	An erect or climbing bean or pea plant of the family Leguminosae. <i>The new diet is high in fruit vegetables and <b>legumes</b>.</i>
<b>livestock</b>	Any animals kept for use or profit. <i>Markets for the trading of <b>livestock</b>.</i>
<b>omnivore</b>	A person who eats all kinds of foods.
<b>pachyderm</b>	A very large mammal with thick skin, especially an elephant, rhinoceros, or hippopotamus.
<b>piggy</b>	A young pig. <i>The <b>piggy</b> fat cheeked little boy and his porcine pot bellied father.</i>
<b>poultry</b>	Domestic fowl, such as chickens, turkeys, ducks, and geese. <i>Anyone handling raw <b>poultry</b> should wash their hands thoroughly.</i>

- rhinoceros** Massive powerful herbivorous odd-toed ungulate of southeast Asia and Africa having very thick skin and one or two horns on the snout.
- ruminant** Of or belonging to ruminants.  
*He was destined to become a **ruminant** a haunter of libraries.*
- sheep** Woolly usually horned ruminant mammal related to the goat.  
*Party members should not follow their leader like **sheep**.*
- shepherd** Tend sheep as a shepherd.  
*As has been recognized throughout history money must be **shepherded** and safeguarded.*
- sow** Place seeds in or on (the ground).  
*The night sky was **sown** with stars.*
