- Soldiers who are regarded as expendable in the face of artillery fire.
- A person or thing regarded only as material for a specific use.






# Synonyms of "Fodder" as a noun (6 Words)

cannon fodder A large artillery gun that is usually on wheels.		
feed	An actor who gives a feed to a fellow performer. A paper <b>feed</b> .	
food	Anything that provides mental stimulus for thinking. Baby <b>food</b> s.	
foodstuff	Consumer goods sold by a grocer. The people depend on sago starch as a basic <b>foodstuff</b> .	
herbage	The right of pasture on another person's land. After rain tall <b>herbage</b> invariably collapses on to the paths.	
pasturage	Land used for pasture. The human species has only engaged in <b>pasturage</b> for 12 000 to 15 000 years.

# Associations of "Fodder" (30 Words)

buffalo	Any of several Old World animals resembling oxen including e g water buffalo Cape buffalo. <i>The problem has <b>buffalo</b>ed the advertising staff.</i>
burro	Small donkey used as a pack animal.
camel	A fabric made from camel hair. A <b>camel</b> coat.
carnivore	Any animal that feeds on flesh. Terrestrial <b>carnivore</b> s have four or five clawed digits on each limb.
cat	A short tapered stick used in the game of tipcat. <i>His mother called me an old cat</i> .
cattle	Animals of a group related to domestic cattle including yak bison and buffaloes. So many head of <b>cattle</b> .



<u>crop</u>	Prepare for crops. The parsley will need protection to continue <b>crop</b> ping through the winter.
<u>cultivate</u>	Raise or grow (plants), especially on a large scale for commercial purposes. <i>Damp well</i> <b>cultivate</b> d soil.
dairy	A farm where dairy products are produced. I rely on soya as a substitute for <b>dairy</b> .
<u>diet</u>	Follow a regimen or a diet as for health reasons. <i>Diet</i> soft drinks.
dog	A wild animal of the dog family. She has <b>dog</b> ged the door shut.
domesticate	Cultivate (a plant) for food. Mammals were first <b>domesticate</b> d for their milk.
domesticated	(of an animal) tame and kept as a pet or on a farm. <i>He is thoroughly <b>domesticated</b></i> .
donkey	A children's card game involving exchanging cards.
<u>elephant</u>	The symbol of the Republican Party; introduced in cartoons by Thomas Nast in 1874.
goat	A wild mammal related to the goat such as the ibex. Just for once stop acting the <b>goat</b> .
graze	Break the skin (of a body part) by scraping. <i>Cattle <b>graze</b> on the open meadows.</i>
herbivore	Any animal that feeds chiefly on grass and other plants. <i>Horses are <b>herbivore</b>s.</i>
herd	Move together like a herd. A <b>herd</b> of elephants.
legume	An erect or climbing bean or pea plant of the family Leguminosae. <i>The new diet is high in fruit vegetables and <b>legume</b>s.</i>
livestock	Any animals kept for use or profit. Markets for the trading of <b>livestock</b> .
omnivore	A person who eats all kinds of foods.
pachyderm	A very large mammal with thick skin, especially an elephant, rhinoceros, or hippopotamus.
piggy	A young pig. The <b>piggy</b> fat cheeked little boy and his porcine pot bellied father.
poultry	Domestic fowl, such as chickens, turkeys, ducks, and geese. Anyone handling raw <b>poultry</b> should wash their hands thoroughly.



rhinoceros	Massive powerful herbivorous odd-toed ungulate of southeast Asia and Africa having very thick skin and one or two horns on the snout.
ruminant	Of or belonging to ruminants. He was destined to become a <b>ruminant</b> a haunter of libraries.
<u>sheep</u>	Woolly usually horned ruminant mammal related to the goat. Party members should not follow their leader like <b>sheep</b> .
<u>shepherd</u>	Tend sheep as a shepherd. As has been recognized throughout history money must be <b>shepherd</b> ed and safeguarded.
SOW	Place seeds in or on (the ground. The night sky was <b>sow</b> n with stars.
