Singular Plural

I **folk-etymologize**You **folk-etymologize**He/She/It **folk-etymologizes**They **folk-etymologize** 

#### Folk-etymologize in Present Continuous (Progressive) Tense

Singular Plural

I am folk-etymologizing We are folk-etymologizing
You are folk-etymologizing
He/She/It is folk-etymologizing They are folk-etymologizing

#### Folk-etymologize in Present Perfect Tense

Singular Plural

I have folk-etymologized We have folk-etymologized You have folk-etymologized He/She/It has folk-etymologized They have folk-etymologized

## Folk-etymologize in Present Perfect Continuous Tense

Singular Plural

I have been folk-etymologizing
You have been folk-etymologizing
He/She/It has been folk-etymologizing
They have been folk-etymologizing

### Folk-etymologize in Past Simple (Indefinite) Tense

Singular Plural

I folk-etymologized We folk-etymologized You folk-etymologized He/She/It folk-etymologized They folk-etymologized

# Folk-etymologize in Past Continuous (Progressive) Tense



Singular Plural

I was folk-etymologizing We were folk-etymologizing
You were folk-etymologizing You were folk-etymologizing
He/She/It was folk-etymologizing They were folk-etymologizing

#### Folk-etymologize in Past Perfect Tense

Singular Plural

I had folk-etymologized We had folk-etymologized You had folk-etymologized He/She/It had folk-etymologized They had folk-etymologized

#### Folk-etymologize in Past Perfect Continuous Tense

**Singular** Plural

I had been folk-etymologizing
You had been folk-etymologizing
He/She/It had been folk-etymologizing
They had been folk-etymologizing

I will folk-etymologize
You will folk-etymologize
He/She/It will folk-etymologize
They will folk-etymologize

You will be folk-etymologizing
He/She/It will be folk-etymologizing
They will be folk-etymologizing
