abidance	Acting according to certain accepted standards.
accede	Yield to another's wish or opinion. Elizabeth I accede d to the throne in 1558.
<u>accordance</u>	Concurrence of opinion. The accordance to Canada of rights of access.
acquiesce	Accept something reluctantly but without protest. Sara acquiesce d in his decision.
acquiescent	Willing to carry out the orders or wishes of another without protest. <i>His acquiescent mood.</i>
agree	Consent or assent to a condition or agree to do something. <i>Yes dreadful isn t it she agreed</i> .
<u>amenable</u>	Responsive to suggestions and influences. Parents who have amenable children.
bowed	Forming or resembling an arch.
compliance	The action or fact of complying with a wish or command. This paper estimates the compliance costs of such a policy change.
compliant	Inclined to comply. Children compliant with the parental will.
comply	Act in accordance with a wish or command. We are unable to comply with your request.
<u>conform</u>	Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions. The changes were introduced to conform with international classifications.
conformable	(of strata in contact) deposited in a continuous sequence, and having the same direction of stratification. Personalities conformable to the ambient level of cultural evolution.
conformance	Correspondence in form or appearance. Conformance to international standards.



<u>conformist</u>	Adhering to established customs or doctrines (especially in religion. Organizations where employees are loyal without being unthinking conformist s.
<u>conformity</u>	Similarity in form or type; agreement in character. The goods were in conformity with the contract.
<u>correspond</u>	Be equivalent or parallel, in mathematics. The doctor and I correspond ed for more than two decades.
<u>deference</u>	A courteous expression (by word or deed) of esteem or regard. His deference to her wishes was very flattering.
<u>ensue</u>	Issue or terminate (in a specified way, state, etc.); end. <i>The difficulties which</i> ensue <i>d from their commitment to Cuba</i> .
<u>equity</u>	The value of the shares issued by a company. People who have built up a significant amount of equity in their homes.
<u>obedience</u>	Behavior intended to please your parents. Children were taught to show their parents obedience .
<u>obedient</u>	Dutifully complying with the commands or instructions of those in authority. <i>Obedient children</i> .
obediently	In an obedient manner. The dog had been sitting obediently by her side.
<u>obey</u>	Be obedient to. The officer was convicted for refusing to obey orders.
<u>observance</u>	A rule to be followed by a religious order. <i>Official anniversary observances.</i>
pertinent	Having precise or logical relevance to the matter at hand. A list of articles pertinent to the discussion.
<u>socialization</u>	The adoption of the behavior patterns of the surrounding culture. Socialization with students has helped her communication skills.
submissive	Abjectly submissive characteristic of a slave or servant. A submissive reply.
subservience	In a subservient state. <i>He demonstrated his complete subservience to his masters.</i>
<u>subservient</u>	Serving as a means to an end. Editors and journalists who express opinions in print that are opposed to the interests of the rich are dismissed and replaced by subservient ones.
