abidance	Acting according to certain accepted standards.
accede	Yield to another’s wish or opinion. <i>Elizabeth I acceded to the throne in 1558.</i>
accordance	Concurrence of opinion. <i>The accordance to Canada of rights of access.</i>
acquiesce	Accept something reluctantly but without protest. <i>Sara acquiesced in his decision.</i>
acquiescent	Willing to carry out the orders or wishes of another without protest. <i>His acquiescent mood.</i>
agree	Consent or assent to a condition or agree to do something. <i>Yes dreadful isn t it she agreed.</i>
amenable	Responsive to suggestions and influences. <i>Parents who have amenable children.</i>
bowed	Forming or resembling an arch.
compliance	The action or fact of complying with a wish or command. <i>This paper estimates the compliance costs of such a policy change.</i>
compliant	Inclined to comply. <i>Children compliant with the parental will.</i>
comply	Act in accordance with a wish or command. <i>We are unable to comply with your request.</i>
conform	Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions. <i>The changes were introduced to conform with international classifications.</i>
conformable	(of strata in contact) deposited in a continuous sequence, and having the same direction of stratification. <i>Personalities conformable to the ambient level of cultural evolution.</i>
conformance	Correspondence in form or appearance. <i>Conformance to international standards.</i>

<u>conformist</u>	Adhering to established customs or doctrines (especially in religion). <i>Organizations where employees are loyal without being unthinking conformists.</i>
<u>conformity</u>	Similarity in form or type; agreement in character. <i>The goods were in conformity with the contract.</i>
<u>correspond</u>	Be equivalent or parallel, in mathematics. <i>The doctor and I corresponded for more than two decades.</i>
<u>deference</u>	A courteous expression (by word or deed) of esteem or regard. <i>His deference to her wishes was very flattering.</i>
<u>ensue</u>	Issue or terminate (in a specified way, state, etc.); end. <i>The difficulties which ensued from their commitment to Cuba.</i>
<u>equity</u>	The value of the shares issued by a company. <i>People who have built up a significant amount of equity in their homes.</i>
<u>obedience</u>	Behavior intended to please your parents. <i>Children were taught to show their parents obedience.</i>
<u>obedient</u>	Dutifully complying with the commands or instructions of those in authority. <i>Obedient children.</i>
<u>obediently</u>	In an obedient manner. <i>The dog had been sitting obediently by her side.</i>
<u>obey</u>	Be obedient to. <i>The officer was convicted for refusing to obey orders.</i>
<u>observance</u>	A rule to be followed by a religious order. <i>Official anniversary observances.</i>
<u>pertinent</u>	Having precise or logical relevance to the matter at hand. <i>A list of articles pertinent to the discussion.</i>
<u>socialization</u>	The adoption of the behavior patterns of the surrounding culture. <i>Socialization with students has helped her communication skills.</i>
<u>submissive</u>	Abjectly submissive characteristic of a slave or servant. <i>A submissive reply.</i>
<u>subservience</u>	In a subservient state. <i>He demonstrated his complete subservience to his masters.</i>
<u>subservient</u>	Serving as a means to an end. <i>Editors and journalists who express opinions in print that are opposed to the interests of the rich are dismissed and replaced by subservient ones.</i>
