<u>adore</u>	Worship; venerate. He just adore d his wife.
affection	A gentle feeling of fondness or liking. <i>He won a place in her affections.</i>
amity	A state of friendship and cordiality. The presence of French troops in Scotland had produced hostility rather than amity .
attached	Appointed to (an organization) for special or temporary duties. A block of attached houses.
attachment	Legal seizure of property. The processor comes complete with a blender attachment .
<u>caress</u>	Touch or stroke lightly in a loving or endearing manner. <i>He showered her with caress</i> es.
cherish	Keep (a hope or ambition) in one's mind. <i>He had long cherished a secret fantasy about his future.</i>
conjugal	Of or relating to marriage or to the relationship between a wife and husband. <i>Conjugal visits.</i>
connubial	In a conjugal manner. <i>Connubial</i> bliss.
cordiality	A cordial disposition.
<u>couple</u>	Engage in sexual intercourse. A cable is couple d up to one of the wheels.
<u>darling</u>	A person who is particularly popular with a certain group. A darling little pillbox hat.
<u>dear</u>	Dearly loved. A dear little puppy.
dote	Be extremely and uncritically fond of. Having an older brother who dote s you a lot is the best thing ever.
doting	Extravagantly or foolishly loving and indulgent. Deceiving her preoccupied and doting husband with a young captain.
embrace	The state of taking in or encircling. His career embrace s a number of activities composing playing and acting.
eros	God of love; son of Aphrodite; identified with Roman Cupid.
<u>fond</u>	(of a hope or belief) foolishly optimistic; naive. I m very fond of Mel.



<u>friendship</u>	A state of mutual trust and support between allied nations. <i>Old ties of love and friendship.</i>
infatuation	Temporary love of an adolescent. <i>He had developed an infatuation with the girl.</i>
kiss	A slight touch of a ball against another ball. The newly married couple kiss ed.
kissing	Affectionate play (or foreplay without contact with the genital organs.
love	A person or thing that one loves. Their love left them indifferent to their surroundings.
<u>lovingly</u>	With love or great care. A lovingly restored building.
married	A person who is married. A married couple.
<u>paramour</u>	A woman who cohabits with an important man.
platonic	Free from physical desire. <i>Platonic love</i> .
treasure	Be fond of; be attached to. My mother gave me the ring and I ll treasure it always.
<u>unrequited</u>	Not returned in kind. <i>Unrequited</i> unanswered love.
