### Synonyms of "Fondly" as an adverb (1 Word)

**lovingly** With love or great care.  
*They smile **lovingly** at each other.*

- *Things I fondly recall from my childhood.*
- *She spoke to her children fondly.*
- *They fondly believed the cheers were for them.*
- *He talks fondly of his grandfather.*

<b>adore</b>	Worship; venerate. <i>He just <b>adored</b> his wife.</i>
<b>affection</b>	A gentle feeling of fondness or liking. <i>He won a place in her <b>affections</b>.</i>
<b>amity</b>	A state of friendship and cordiality. <i>The presence of French troops in Scotland had produced hostility rather than <b>amity</b>.</i>
<b>attached</b>	Appointed to (an organization) for special or temporary duties. <i>A block of <b>attached</b> houses.</i>
<b>attachment</b>	Legal seizure of property. <i>The processor comes complete with a blender <b>attachment</b>.</i>
<b>caress</b>	Touch or stroke lightly in a loving or endearing manner. <i>He showered her with <b>caresses</b>.</i>
<b>cherish</b>	Keep (a hope or ambition) in one's mind. <i>He had long <b>cherished</b> a secret fantasy about his future.</i>
<b>conjugal</b>	Of or relating to marriage or to the relationship between a wife and husband. <i><b>Conjugal</b> visits.</i>
<b>connubial</b>	In a conjugal manner. <i><b>Connubial</b> bliss.</i>
<b>cordiality</b>	A cordial disposition.
<b>couple</b>	Engage in sexual intercourse. <i>A cable is <b>coupled</b> up to one of the wheels.</i>
<b>darling</b>	A person who is particularly popular with a certain group. <i>A <b>darling</b> little pillbox hat.</i>
<b>dear</b>	Dearly loved. <i>A <b>dear</b> little puppy.</i>
<b>dote</b>	Be extremely and uncritically fond of. <i>Having an older brother who <b>dots</b> you a lot is the best thing ever.</i>
<b>doting</b>	Extravagantly or foolishly loving and indulgent. <i>Deceiving her preoccupied and <b>doting</b> husband with a young captain.</i>
<b>embrace</b>	The state of taking in or encircling. <i>His career <b>embraces</b> a number of activities composing playing and acting.</i>
<b>eros</b>	God of love; son of Aphrodite; identified with Roman Cupid.
<b>fond</b>	(of a hope or belief) foolishly optimistic; naive. <i>I m very <b>fond</b> of Mel.</i>

<b>friendship</b>	A state of mutual trust and support between allied nations. <i>Old ties of love and <b>friendship</b>.</i>
<b>infatuation</b>	Temporary love of an adolescent. <i>He had developed an <b>infatuation</b> with the girl.</i>
<b>kiss</b>	A slight touch of a ball against another ball. <i>The newly married couple <b>kissed</b>.</i>
<b>kissing</b>	Affectionate play (or foreplay without contact with the genital organs).
<b>love</b>	A person or thing that one loves. <i>Their <b>love</b> left them indifferent to their surroundings.</i>
<b>lovingly</b>	With love or great care. <i>A <b>lovingly</b> restored building.</i>
<b>married</b>	A person who is married. <i>A <b>married</b> couple.</i>
<b>paramour</b>	A woman who cohabits with an important man.
<b>platonic</b>	Free from physical desire. <i><b>Platonic</b> love.</i>
<b>treasure</b>	Be fond of; be attached to. <i>My mother gave me the ring and I ll <b>treasure</b> it always.</i>
<b>unrequited</b>	Not returned in kind. <i><b>Unrequited</b> unanswered love.</i>
