<b>autonomous</b>	Existing as an independent entity. <i>School governors are legally <b>autonomous</b>.</i>
<b>complimentary</b>	Expressing a compliment; praising or approving. <i>Jennie was very <b>complimentary</b> about Kath s riding.</i>
<a href="#">discretion</a>	The trait of judging wisely and objectively. <i>Local authorities should use their <b>discretion</b> in setting the charges.</i>
<a href="#">disengage</a>	Release from something that holds fast, connects, or entangles. <i>The clutch will not <b>disengage</b>.</i>
<a href="#">dislodge</a>	Remove or force out from a position. <i>The new employee <b>dislodged</b> her by moving into her office space.</i>
<b>emancipate</b>	Set free, especially from legal, social, or political restrictions. <i>The citizen must be <b>emancipated</b> from the obsessive secrecy of government.</i>
<b>emancipation</b>	Freeing someone from the control of another; especially a parent’s relinquishing authority and control over a minor child. <i>The early struggle for <b>emancipation</b> from slavery.</i>
<a href="#">freelance</a>	Earn one s living as a freelance. <i>A <b>freelance</b> journalist.</i>
<b>gratis</b>	Given or done for nothing; free. <i>A monthly programme was issued <b>gratis</b>.</i>
<b>illimitable</b>	Without limits in extent or size or quantity. <i>The <b>illimitable</b> human capacity for evil.</i>
<a href="#">inexpensive</a>	Not costing a great deal; cheap. <i><b>Inexpensive</b> family restaurants.</i>

<b>informal</b>	Having or fostering a warm or friendly and informal atmosphere. <i>An <b>informal</b> atmosphere.</i>
<b>leeway</b>	A permissible difference; allowing some freedom to move within limits. <i>The government had greater <b>leeway</b> to introduce reforms.</i>
<b>liberally</b>	In a generous manner. <i>He gave <b>liberally</b> to several charities.</i>
<b><u>liberate</u></b>	Release (gas or energy) as a result of a chemical reaction or physical decomposition. <i>Ways of working politically that <b>liberate</b> women.</i>
<b><u>liberation</u></b>	The attempt to achieve equal rights or status. <i>She worked for women's <b>liberation</b>.</i>
<b><u>liberty</u></b>	The personification of liberty as a female figure. <i>How did he know what she was thinking it was a <b>liberty</b>.</i>
<b><u>loose</u></b>	Loose play. <i>A box of <b>loose</b> nails.</i>
<b><u>loosely</u></b>	In a way that is not close, compact, or solid in structure or formation. <i>Buildings are grouped <b>loosely</b> around a village green.</i>
<b>looseness</b>	A lack of strict accuracy; laxity of practice. <i>Misunderstandings can often be traced to a <b>looseness</b> of expression.</i>
<b>manumit</b>	Release from slavery; set free. <i>Old Angus had never <b>manumitted</b> a single slave.</i>
<b>renewable</b>	Capable of being renewed; replaceable. <i>We are on <b>renewable</b> annual contracts.</i>
<b>separatist</b>	Relating to separatists or separatism. <i>Religious <b>separatists</b>.</i>
<b>unencumbered</b>	Not having any burden or impediment. <i>He needed to travel light and <b>unencumbered</b>.</i>
<b>unfettered</b>	Not bound by shackles and chains. <i><b>Unfettered</b> artistic genius.</i>
<b><u>unofficial</u></b>	Denoting strike action not called or endorsed by the union to which the strikers belong. <i>The early election returns are <b>unofficial</b>.</i>
<b>unrestricted</b>	Accessible to all. <i><b>Unrestricted</b> access to both military bases.</i>
<b>untie</b>	Undo or unfasten (something that is tied or tied up). <i>Morton <b>untied</b> the parcel.</i>
