aftermath	The consequences of an event (especially a catastrophic event). <i>Food prices soared in the aftermath of the drought.</i>
aftershock	A smaller earthquake following the main shock of a large earthquake.
aid	A grant of subsidy or tax to a king or queen. <i>He saw the pilot slumped in his cockpit and went to his aid.</i>
befall	(especially of something bad) happen to (someone). <i>He promised that no harm would befall her.</i>
beset	Assail or attack on all sides. <i>She was beset with self doubt.</i>
betide	Become of; happen to. <i>I waited with beating heart not knowing what would betide.</i>
blow	Free of obstruction by blowing air through. <i>Certain insects are said to blow.</i>
calamity	An event resulting in great loss and misfortune. <i>The whole city was affected by the irremediable calamity.</i>
cataclysm	A large-scale and violent event in the natural world. <i>The cataclysm at the end of the Cretaceous Period.</i>
catastrophe	The denouement of a drama, especially a classical tragedy. <i>The tax would be a catastrophe for the industry.</i>
dilemma	A situation in which a difficult choice has to be made between two or more alternatives, especially ones that are equally undesirable. <i>He wants to make money but he also disapproves of it Den s dilemma in a nutshell.</i>
disaster	An act that has disastrous consequences. <i>A disaster movie.</i>
disruption	An act of delaying or interrupting the continuity. <i>The scheme was planned to minimize disruption.</i>

<u>earthquake</u>	A great upheaval. <i>Selling the company caused an earthquake among the employees.</i>
hardship	Severe suffering or privation. <i>The many hardships of frontier life.</i>
holocaust	Destruction or slaughter on a mass scale, especially caused by fire or nuclear war. <i>A nuclear holocaust.</i>
<u>impending</u>	(of an event regarded as threatening or significant) about to happen; forthcoming. <i>My impending departure.</i>
misadventure	An instance of misfortune. <i>The coroner recorded a verdict of death by misadventure.</i>
mischance	An unpredictable outcome that is unfortunate. <i>By pure mischance the secret was revealed.</i>
<u>misfortune</u>	Unnecessary and unforeseen trouble resulting from an unfortunate event. <i>The project was dogged by misfortune.</i>
<u>mishap</u>	An unlucky accident. <i>Although there were a few minor mishaps none of the pancakes stuck to the ceiling.</i>
<u>needy</u>	Needy people collectively. <i>Those from needy backgrounds.</i>
perturbation	A minor deviation in the course of a celestial body, caused by the attraction of a neighbouring body. <i>The term distress connotes some degree of perturbation and emotional upset.</i>
<u>plight</u>	A dangerous, difficult, or otherwise unfortunate situation. <i>We must direct our efforts towards relieving the plight of children living in poverty.</i>
seismic	Relating to or denoting geological surveying methods involving vibrations produced artificially by explosions. <i>Seismic data show the deep structure of rift systems.</i>
suffering	Psychological suffering. <i>A message of hope for suffering humanity.</i>
<u>survival</u>	An object or practice that has continued to exist from an earlier time. <i>His shorts were a survival from his army days.</i>
<u>tragedy</u>	A play dealing with tragic events and having an unhappy ending, especially one concerning the downfall of the main character. <i>Greek tragedy.</i>

unaccustomed Not familiar or usual; out of the ordinary.
*Many varieties of **unaccustomed** foods.*

worst Most severely or seriously.
*The invaders did their **worst**.*
