aid	A grant of subsidy or tax to a king or queen. <i>He saw the pilot slumped in his cockpit and went to his <b>aid</b>.</i>
befall	(especially of something bad) happen to (someone. <i>He promised that no harm would <b>befall</b> her.</i>
<u>beset</u>	Assail or attack on all sides. She was <b>beset</b> with self doubt.
betide	Become of; happen to. I waited with beating heart not knowing what would <b>betide</b> .
blow	Free of obstruction by blowing air through. <i>Certain insects are said to <b>blow</b>.</i>
<u>calamity</u>	An event resulting in great loss and misfortune. The whole city was affected by the irremediable <b>calamity</b> .
cataclysm	A large-scale and violent event in the natural world. The <b>cataclysm</b> at the end of the Cretaceous Period.
catastrophe	The denouement of a drama, especially a classical tragedy. The tax would be a <b>catastrophe</b> for the industry.
<u>dilemma</u>	A situation in which a difficult choice has to be made between two or more alternatives, especially ones that are equally undesirable. <i>He wants to make money but he also disapproves of it Den s dilemma in a</i> <i>nutshell.</i>
disaster	An act that has disastrous consequences. A <b>disaster</b> movie.
disruption	An act of delaying or interrupting the continuity. The scheme was planned to minimize <b>disruption</b> .



A great upheaval. Selling the company caused an <b>earthquake</b> among the employees.
Severe suffering or privation. The many <b>hardship</b> s of frontier life.
Destruction or slaughter on a mass scale, especially caused by fire or nuclear war. A nuclear <b>holocaust</b> .
(of an event regarded as threatening or significant) about to happen; forthcoming. My <b>impending</b> departure.
An instance of misfortune. The coroner recorded a verdict of death by <b>misadventure</b> .
An unpredictable outcome that is unfortunate. By pure <b>mischance</b> the secret was revealed.
Unnecessary and unforeseen trouble resulting from an unfortunate event. <i>The project was dogged by misfortune.</i>
An unlucky accident. Although there were a few minor <b>mishap</b> s none of the pancakes stuck to the ceiling.
Needy people collectively. Those from <b>needy</b> backgrounds.
A minor deviation in the course of a celestial body, caused by the attraction of a neighbouring body. The term distress connotes some degree of <b>perturbation</b> and emotional upset.
A dangerous, difficult, or otherwise unfortunate situation. We must direct our efforts towards relieving the <b>plight</b> of children living in poverty.
Relating to or denoting geological surveying methods involving vibrations produced artificially by explosions. <b>Seismic</b> data show the deep structure of rift systems.
Psychological suffering. A message of hope for <b>suffering</b> humanity.
An object or practice that has continued to exist from an earlier time. His shorts were a <b>survival</b> from his army days.
A play dealing with tragic events and having an unhappy ending, especially one concerning the downfall of the main character. <i>Greek tragedy</i> .
