## Associations of "For adversity" (30 Words)

<a href="#">aftermath</a>	The consequences of an event (especially a catastrophic event). <i>Food prices soared in the <b>aftermath</b> of the drought.</i>
<b>aftershock</b>	A smaller earthquake following the main shock of a large earthquake.
<b>aid</b>	A grant of subsidy or tax to a king or queen. <i>He saw the pilot slumped in his cockpit and went to his <b>aid</b>.</i>
<b>befall</b>	(especially of something bad) happen to (someone). <i>He promised that no harm would <b>befall</b> her.</i>
<a href="#">beset</a>	Assail or attack on all sides. <i>She was <b>beset</b> with self doubt.</i>
<b>betide</b>	Become of; happen to. <i>I waited with beating heart not knowing what would <b>betide</b>.</i>
<b>blow</b>	Free of obstruction by blowing air through. <i>Certain insects are said to <b>blow</b>.</i>
<a href="#">calamity</a>	An event resulting in great loss and misfortune. <i>The whole city was affected by the irremediable <b>calamity</b>.</i>
<b>cataclysm</b>	A large-scale and violent event in the natural world. <i>The <b>cataclysm</b> at the end of the Cretaceous Period.</i>
<b>catastrophe</b>	The denouement of a drama, especially a classical tragedy. <i>The tax would be a <b>catastrophe</b> for the industry.</i>
<a href="#">dilemma</a>	A situation in which a difficult choice has to be made between two or more alternatives, especially ones that are equally undesirable. <i>He wants to make money but he also disapproves of it Den s <b>dilemma</b> in a nutshell.</i>
<b>disaster</b>	An act that has disastrous consequences. <i>A <b>disaster</b> movie.</i>
<b>disruption</b>	An act of delaying or interrupting the continuity. <i>The scheme was planned to minimize <b>disruption</b>.</i>

<b><u>earthquake</u></b>	A great upheaval. <i>Selling the company caused an <b>earthquake</b> among the employees.</i>
<b>hardship</b>	Severe suffering or privation. <i>The many <b>hardships</b> of frontier life.</i>
<b>holocaust</b>	Destruction or slaughter on a mass scale, especially caused by fire or nuclear war. <i>A nuclear <b>holocaust</b>.</i>
<b><u>impending</u></b>	(of an event regarded as threatening or significant) about to happen; forthcoming. <i>My <b>impending</b> departure.</i>
<b>misadventure</b>	An instance of misfortune. <i>The coroner recorded a verdict of death by <b>misadventure</b>.</i>
<b>mischance</b>	An unpredictable outcome that is unfortunate. <i>By pure <b>mischance</b> the secret was revealed.</i>
<b><u>misfortune</u></b>	Unnecessary and unforeseen trouble resulting from an unfortunate event. <i>The project was dogged by <b>misfortune</b>.</i>
<b><u>mishap</u></b>	An unlucky accident. <i>Although there were a few minor <b>mishaps</b> none of the pancakes stuck to the ceiling.</i>
<b><u>needy</u></b>	Needy people collectively. <i>Those from <b>needy</b> backgrounds.</i>
<b>perturbation</b>	A minor deviation in the course of a celestial body, caused by the attraction of a neighbouring body. <i>The term distress connotes some degree of <b>perturbation</b> and emotional upset.</i>
<b><u>plight</u></b>	A dangerous, difficult, or otherwise unfortunate situation. <i>We must direct our efforts towards relieving the <b>plight</b> of children living in poverty.</i>
<b>seismic</b>	Relating to or denoting geological surveying methods involving vibrations produced artificially by explosions. <i><b>Seismic</b> data show the deep structure of rift systems.</i>
<b>suffering</b>	Psychological suffering. <i>A message of hope for <b>suffering</b> humanity.</i>
<b><u>survival</u></b>	An object or practice that has continued to exist from an earlier time. <i>His shorts were a <b>survival</b> from his army days.</i>
<b><u>tragedy</u></b>	A play dealing with tragic events and having an unhappy ending, especially one concerning the downfall of the main character. <i>Greek <b>tragedy</b>.</i>

**unaccustomed** Not familiar or usual; out of the ordinary.

**worst** Most severely or seriously.  
*The invaders did their **worst**.*
