## Associations of "For assassin" (30 Words)

<b>accused</b>	A defendant in a criminal proceeding. <i>The <b>accused</b> was ordered to stand trial on a number of charges.</i>
<b>assassinate</b>	Murder (an important person) for political or religious reasons. <i>He <b>assassinated</b> his enemy s character.</i>
<b>assassination</b>	An attack intended to ruin someone’s reputation. <i>A failed <b>assassination</b> attempt.</i>
<b>assault</b>	The crime of forcing a person to submit to sexual intercourse against his or her will. <i>Thunder <b>assaulted</b> the ears.</i>
<b>attempted</b>	Tried unsuccessfully. <i><b>Attempted</b> murder.</i>
<b>chartered</b>	(of a city, company, university, or other body) founded or having its rights and privileges established by means of a charter. <i>A <b>chartered</b> plane.</i>
<a href="#">collusion</a>	Collusion between ostensible opponents in a lawsuit. <i>The armed forces were working in <b>collusion</b> with drug traffickers.</i>
<b>conscienceless</b>	Lacking a conscience. <i>Brash unprincipled and <b>conscienceless</b>.</i>
<b>conspirator</b>	A member of a conspiracy. <i><b>Conspirators</b> had planned to seize the state.</i>
<a href="#">convict</a>	A person who has been convicted of a criminal offense. <i>Two escaped <b>convicts</b> kidnapped them at gunpoint.</i>
<b>culpable</b>	Deserving blame. <i><b>Culpable</b> negligence.</i>
<a href="#">dispatch</a>	A report sent in from abroad by a journalist. <i>The government <b>dispatched</b> 150 police to restore order.</i>

<b>employed</b>	Having your services engaged for; or having a job especially one that pays wages or a salary. <i>Up to 40 per cent of <b>employed</b> people are in part time jobs.</i>
<b>genocide</b>	The deliberate killing of a large number of people from a particular nation or ethnic group with the aim of destroying that nation or group. <i>News of <b>genocides</b> went unreported.</i>
<b>hired</b>	Hired for the exclusive temporary use of a group of travelers. <i>A <b>hired</b> gun.</i>
<b>homicide</b>	A murderer. <i>Knives account for a third of all <b>homicides</b>.</i>
<b>killer</b>	An animal that has been selected for slaughter. <i>I woke up with a <b>killer</b> hangover.</i>
<b>killing</b>	The act of terminating a life. <i>Years of <b>killing</b> and destruction.</i>
<b>massacre</b>	Kill a large number of people indiscriminately. <i>Thousands were brutally <b>massacred</b> by soldiers.</i>
<b>murderer</b>	A person who commits murder. <i>Convicted <b>murderers</b>.</i>
<b>psychopathic</b>	Suffering from or constituting a chronic mental disorder with abnormal or violent social behaviour. <i>An obsessive attention to detail that looked almost <b>psychopathic</b>.</i>
<b>regicide</b>	Someone who commits regicide the killer of a king.
<b>slaughter</b>	Kill (animals) for food. <i>The <b>slaughter</b> of 20 peaceful demonstrators.</i>
<b>slay</b>	Kill (a person or animal) in a violent way. <i>You <b>slay</b> me you really do.</i>
<b>slayer</b>	Someone who kills a person or animal in a violent way. <i>David the <b>slayer</b> of Goliath.</i>
<b>suicide</b>	A person who commits suicide. <i>We shot free throws and if we missed we ran <b>suicides</b>.</i>
<b>unconscionable</b>	Not right or reasonable. <i>An <b>unconscionable</b> liar.</i>
<b>wanted</b>	Desired or wished for or sought. <i>So good to feel <b>wanted</b>.</i>
