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## Associations of "For assertive" (30 Words)

<b>accent</b>	Put stress on utter with an accent. <i>A strong American <b>accent</b>.</i>
<b>accentuate</b>	Put stress on; utter with an accent. <i>His jacket unfortunately <b>accentuated</b> his paunch.</i>
<b>arrogant</b>	Having or showing feelings of unwarranted importance out of overbearing pride. <i>A typically <b>arrogant</b> assumption.</i>
<b>autocratic</b>	Offensively self-assured or given to exercising usually unwarranted power. <i><b>Autocratic</b> behavior.</i>
<b>brash</b>	Having an ostentatious or tasteless appearance. <i>He was <b>brash</b> cocky and arrogant.</i>
<b>categorical</b>	Unambiguously explicit and direct. <i>A <b>categorical</b> denial.</i>
<b>cavalier</b>	Given to haughty disregard of others. <i>Anne was irritated by his <b>cavalier</b> attitude.</i>
<b>confident</b>	Not liable to error in judgment or action. <i>A <b>confident</b> speaker.</i>
<b>despotic</b>	Of or typical of a despot; tyrannical. <i>A <b>despotic</b> regime.</i>
<b>dictatorial</b>	Having or showing an autocratic manner. <i>A <b>dictatorial</b> regime.</i>
<b>domineering</b>	Asserting one's will over another in an arrogant way. <i>How can I do my job with a <b>domineering</b> boss yelling in my ear.</i>
<b>emphasis</b>	Vigour or intensity of expression. <i>Inflection and <b>emphasis</b> can change the meaning of what is said.</i>
<b>emphasized</b>	Spoken with emphasis.

<b><u>emphatic</u></b>	An emphatic consonant. <i>The children were <b>emphatic</b> that they would like to repeat the experience.</i>
<b><u>emphatically</u></b>	In a forceful way. <i>Greg is <b>emphatically</b> not a slacker.</i>
<b>forceful</b>	Forceful and definite in expression or action. <i>She was a <b>forceful</b> personality.</i>
<b><u>fortified</u></b>	Secured with bastions or fortifications. <i><b>Fortified</b> wine.</i>
<b><u>haughty</u></b>	Having or showing arrogant superiority to and disdain of those one views as unworthy. <i>A look of <b>haughty</b> disdain.</i>
<b>headstrong</b>	Energetically wilful and determined. <i>The <b>headstrong</b> impulsiveness of youth.</i>
<b>highlight</b>	Create highlights in hair. <i>I ve had my hair <b>highlighted</b> regularly for the last ten years.</i>
<b><u>imperative</u></b>	A verb or phrase in the imperative mood. <i>Free movement of labour was an economic <b>imperative</b>.</i>
<b>imperious</b>	Having or showing arrogant superiority to and disdain of those one views as unworthy. <i>His <b>imperious</b> demands.</i>
<b><u>oppressive</u></b>	Weighing heavily on the senses or spirit. <i><b>Oppressive</b> sorrows.</i>
<b><u>overbearing</u></b>	Unpleasantly overpowering. <i>An <b>overbearing</b> ill tempered brute.</i>
<b>peremptory</b>	Insisting on immediate attention or obedience, especially in a brusquely imperious way. <i>A swaggering <b>peremptory</b> manner.</i>
<b>stressed</b>	Strengthened by the application of stress during manufacture prestressed. <i><b>Stressed</b> workers reported smoking more.</i>
<b>strong</b>	Having a strong physiological or chemical effect. <i>A <b>strong</b> smell.</i>
<b>strongly</b>	In a very intense or distinctive manner. <i>He was <b>strongly</b> affected by the divorce of his parents.</i>
<b>supercilious</b>	Behaving or looking as though one thinks one is superior to others. <i>His mother eyed my clothes with a <b>supercilious</b> air.</i>
<b><u>tyrannical</u></b>	Characteristic of tyranny; oppressive and controlling. <i>A <b>tyrannical</b> government.</i>
