<b>avow</b>	To declare or affirm solemnly and formally as true. <i>He <b>avowed</b> that he had voted Labour in every election.</i>
<a href="#">certain</a>	Certain to occur destined or inevitable. <i>What is <b>certain</b> is that every effect must have a cause.</i>
<a href="#">clarify</a>	Make clear and (more) comprehensible. <i>The report managed to <b>clarify</b> the government s position.</i>
<b>confident</b>	A confidant. <i>This time they re <b>confident</b> of a happy ending.</i>
<b>confidently</b>	In a way that expresses little or no doubt about something. <i>He <b>confidently</b> predicts a change of fortune.</i>
<a href="#">convince</a>	Cause (someone) to believe firmly in the truth of something. <i>She <b>convinced</b> my father to branch out on his own.</i>
<a href="#">declare</a>	Declare to be. <i>The prime minister <b>declared</b> that the programme of austerity had paid off.</i>
<b>encourage</b>	Contribute to the progress or growth of. <i>Pupils are <b>encouraged</b> to be creative.</i>

<b>ensure</b>	Make certain of obtaining or providing (something). <i>Only by researching stocks thoroughly can a client <b>ensure</b> against being misled.</i>
<b>exaction</b>	Act of demanding or levying by force or authority. <i><b>Exaction</b> of tribute.</i>
<b>foolproof</b>	Not liable to failure. <i><b>Foolproof</b> this appliance.</i>
<b>grandiloquence</b>	High-flown style; excessive use of verbal ornamentation.
<b>guarantee</b>	Provide a guarantee for. <i>We offer a 10 year <b>guarantee</b> against rusting.</i>
<b>induce</b>	Cause to occur rapidly. <i>From the experimental evidence one infers or <b>induces</b> the hypothesis.</i>
<b>magniloquent</b>	Using high-flown or bombastic language.
<b>oath</b>	A commitment to tell the truth especially in a court of law to lie under oath is to become subject to prosecution for perjury. <i>He was muttering foul <b>oaths</b>.</i>
<b>persuadable</b>	Easily persuaded; amenable. <i>They need to identify the most <b>persuadable</b> voters.</i>
<b>persuade</b>	Win approval or support for. <i>You can't <b>persuade</b> me to buy this ugly vase.</i>
<b>pledge</b>	Bind or secure by a pledge. <i>I have no intention of giving you anything that could be held against me as a <b>pledge</b>.</i>
<b>promise</b>	Make a promise or commitment. <i>We're <b>promised</b> more winter weather tonight.</i>
<b>purport</b>	The intended meaning of a communication. <i>The <b>purport</b> of existence.</i>
<b>reassure</b>	Give or restore confidence in; cause to feel sure or certain. <i>Joachim <b>reassured</b> him that he was needed.</i>
<b>rhetoric</b>	Using language effectively to please or persuade. <i>All we have from the Opposition is empty <b>rhetoric</b>.</i>
<b>shout</b>	Prevent someone from speaking or being heard by shouting. <i>He leant out of his window and <b>shouted</b> abuse at them.</i>
<b>sure</b>	Having or feeling no doubt or uncertainty confident and assured. <i>Her neck was red a <b>sure</b> sign of agitation.</i>
<b>vouch</b>	Summon a vouchee into court to warrant or defend a title. <i>He <b>vouched</b> his words by his deeds.</i>
