heed Pay close attention to give heed to.

If he heard he paid no **heed**.

mindful Inclined or willing to do something.

Mindful of his responsibilities.

The quality of being relatively moderate, limited, or small in amount, rate, or

**observant** Adhering strictly to the rules of a particular religion, especially Judaism.
