Associations of "For beg" (30 Words)

appeal	An application to a higher court for a decision to be reversed. <i>I appealed to the law of 1900.</i>
asking	The verbal act of requesting.
<u>beseech</u>	Ask (someone) urgently and fervently to do something; implore; entreat. <i>They earnestly beseeched his forgiveness.</i>
cadge	Ask for or obtain (something to which one is not strictly entitled). <i>He cadged fivers off old school friends.</i>
<u>conjure</u>	Engage in plotting or enter into a conspiracy, swear together. <i>Anne conjured up a delicious home made hotpot.</i>
<u>crave</u>	Feel a powerful desire for (something). <i>Will craved for family life.</i>
<u>desperately</u>	Used to emphasize the extreme degree of something. <i>I am desperately disappointed.</i>
<u>entreat</u>	Ask someone earnestly or anxiously to do something. <i>His friends entreated him not to go.</i>
entreaty	An earnest or humble request. <i>An entreaty to stop the fighting.</i>
exhortation	An address or communication emphatically urging someone to do something. <i>No amount of exhortation had any effect.</i>
implore	Beg earnestly for. <i>Please don t talk that way Ellen implored.</i>
<u>invitation</u>	The action of inviting someone to go somewhere or to do something. <i>Tactics like those of the colonel would have been an invitation to disaster.</i>
mendicant	A member of a mendicant order. <i>Mendicant friars.</i>

necessary	Determined, existing, or happening by natural laws or predestination; inevitable. <i>A bag containing my wallet the money the necessary.</i>
need	Have or feel a need for. <i>A general state of need exists among the homeless.</i>
perforce	Used to express necessity or inevitability. <i>Amateurs perforce have to settle for less expensive solutions.</i>
petition	Write a petition for something to somebody request formally and in writing. <i>The organization is petitioning the EU for a moratorium on the patent.</i>
plea	A formal statement by or on behalf of a defendant or prisoner, stating guilt or innocence in response to a charge, offering an allegation of fact, or claiming that a point of law should apply. <i>He made a dramatic plea for disarmament.</i>
plead	Make an allegation in an action or other legal proceeding especially answer the previous pleading of the other party by denying facts therein stated or by alleging new facts. <i>The Constitution prohibits a retired Supreme Court judge from pleading before any court.</i>
please	Give pleasure to or be pleasing to. <i>These colors please the senses.</i>
pray	Address a deity a prophet a saint or an object of worship say a prayer. <i>And what pray was the purpose of that.</i>
propitiate	Make peace with. <i>The pagans thought it was important to propitiate the gods with sacrifices.</i>
request	The verbal act of requesting. <i>The computer is busy servicing requests from other processes.</i>
solicit	Make a solicitation or entreaty for something request urgently or persistently. <i>Historians and critics are solicited for opinions by the auction houses.</i>
solicitation	Request for a sum of money. <i>A woman arrested for solicitation.</i>
suppliant	A person making a humble or earnest plea to someone in power or authority. <i>Their faces were wary and suppliant.</i>
supplicant	One praying humbly for something. <i>A supplicant serf before an ill tempered monarch.</i>
supplicate	Ask humbly (for something). <i>The plutocracy supplicated to be made peers.</i>
want	Hunt or look for want for a particular reason. <i>You don t want to believe everything you hear.</i>
