The main artery of the body, supplying oxygenated blood to the circulatory

aorta system. In humans it passes over the heart from the left ventricle and runs

down in front of the backbone.

cardiovascular Of or pertaining to or involving the heart and blood vessels.

Increased risk of death from **cardiovascular** disease.

clog Impede with a clog or as if with a clog.

clot Form or cause to form clots.

Its nostrils were **clot**ted with blood.

Cause (a fluid) to change to a solid or semi-solid state.

coagulate Coagulated blood.

coronary Obstruction of blood flow in a coronary artery by a blood clot thrombus.

A disease in which the body's ability to produce or respond to the

diabetes hormone insulin is impaired, resulting in abnormal metabolism of

carbohydrates and elevated levels of glucose in the blood.

embolism An insertion into a calendar.

One patient died of a pulmonary **embolism**.

erythrocyte

A mature blood cell that contains hemoglobin to carry oxygen to the bodily

tissues; a biconcave disc that has no nucleus.



alucose

A syrup containing glucose and other sugars made by hydrolysis of starch

and used in the food industry.

A hemoprotein composed of globin and heme that gives red blood cells

their characteristic color; function primarily to transport oxygen from the

hemoglobin lungs to the body tissues.

Fish have simpler **hemoglobin** than mammals.

hypertension A common disorder in which blood pressure remains abnormally high (a

reading of 140/90 mm Hg or greater.

inject Inject oneself with a narcotic drug especially habitually.

He was forcibly **inject**ed with a sedative.

A hormone produced in the pancreas by the islets of Langerhans which

insulin regulates the amount of glucose in the blood The lack of insulin causes a

form of diabetes.

intercellular Located or occurring between cells.

Intercellular spaces.

lymphatic Of or relating to or produced by lymph.

Lymphatic drainage.

oxygenation The process of providing or combining or treating with oxygen.

The **oxygenation** of the blood.

A substance analogous to ionized gas plasma consisting of mobile charged

particles such as a molten salt or the electrons within a metal.

Plasma physics.

A website or web page providing access or links to other sites.

primogenitor An ancestor, especially the earliest ancestor of a people; a progenitor.

Relating to or affecting the lungs.

Pulmonary disease.

A serious condition resulting from the presence of harmful

sepsis microorganisms in the blood or other tissues and the body's response to

their presence, potentially leading to the malfunctioning of various organs,

shock, and death.
