## Associations of "For blood" (30 Words)

<b>aorta</b>	The main artery of the body, supplying oxygenated blood to the circulatory system. In humans it passes over the heart from the left ventricle and runs down in front of the backbone.
<b>arterial</b>	Denoting an important route in a system of roads, railway lines, or rivers. <i>One of the main <b>arterial</b> routes from York.</i>
<a href="#">artery</a>	A blood vessel that carries blood from the heart to the body. <i>George Street main <b>artery</b> of Edinburgh s Golden Mile.</i>
<b>bloodstream</b>	The blood flowing through the circulatory system.
<b>capillary</b>	A tube of small internal diameter holds liquid by capillary action. <i>A <b>capillary</b> tube.</i>
<b>cardiovascular</b>	Of or pertaining to or involving the heart and blood vessels. <i>Increased risk of death from <b>cardiovascular</b> disease.</i>
<b>clog</b>	Impede with a clog or as if with a clog. <i>Fear <b>clogged</b> her mind.</i>
<b>clot</b>	Form or cause to form clots. <i>Its nostrils were <b>clotted</b> with blood.</i>
<b>coagulate</b>	Cause (a fluid) to change to a solid or semi-solid state. <i><b>Coagulated</b> blood.</i>
<b>coronary</b>	Obstruction of blood flow in a coronary artery by a blood clot thrombus.
<b>diabetes</b>	A disease in which the body's ability to produce or respond to the hormone insulin is impaired, resulting in abnormal metabolism of carbohydrates and elevated levels of glucose in the blood.
<b>embolism</b>	An insertion into a calendar. <i>One patient died of a pulmonary <b>embolism</b>.</i>
<b>erythrocyte</b>	A mature blood cell that contains hemoglobin to carry oxygen to the bodily tissues; a biconcave disc that has no nucleus.

<b>glucose</b>	A syrup containing glucose and other sugars made by hydrolysis of starch and used in the food industry.
<b>hemoglobin</b>	A hemoprotein composed of globin and heme that gives red blood cells their characteristic color; function primarily to transport oxygen from the lungs to the body tissues. <i>Fish have simpler <b>hemoglobin</b> than mammals.</i>
<b>hypertension</b>	A common disorder in which blood pressure remains abnormally high (a reading of 140/90 mm Hg or greater).
<b>inject</b>	Inject oneself with a narcotic drug especially habitually. <i>He was forcibly <b>injected</b> with a sedative.</i>
<b>insulin</b>	A hormone produced in the pancreas by the islets of Langerhans which regulates the amount of glucose in the blood The lack of insulin causes a form of diabetes.
<b>intercellular</b>	Located or occurring between cells. <i><b>Intercellular</b> spaces.</i>
<b>jugular</b>	Veins in the neck that return blood from the head. <i>He always goes for the <b>jugular</b>.</i>
<b>lipid</b>	An oily organic compound insoluble in water but soluble in organic solvents; essential structural component of living cells (along with proteins and carbohydrates).
<b>lymphatic</b>	Of or relating to or produced by lymph. <i><b>Lymphatic</b> drainage.</i>
<b>oxygenation</b>	The process of providing or combining or treating with oxygen. <i>The <b>oxygenation</b> of the blood.</i>
<b>plasma</b>	A substance analogous to ionized gas plasma consisting of mobile charged particles such as a molten salt or the electrons within a metal. <i><b>Plasma</b> physics.</i>
<b>portal</b>	A website or web page providing access or links to other sites. <i>The <b>portals</b> of success.</i>
<b>primogenitor</b>	An ancestor, especially the earliest ancestor of a people; a progenitor.
<b>pulmonary</b>	Relating to or affecting the lungs. <i><b>Pulmonary</b> disease.</i>
<b>sepsis</b>	A serious condition resulting from the presence of harmful microorganisms in the blood or other tissues and the body's response to their presence, potentially leading to the malfunctioning of various organs, shock, and death.
<b>vein</b>	Make a veinlike pattern. <i>All <b>veins</b> except the pulmonary <b>vein</b> carry unaerated blood.</i>

**venous** Relating to a vein or the veins.
