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## Associations of "For church" (30 Words)

<b>abbess</b>	A woman who is the head of an abbey of nuns.
<b>abbey</b>	A church that was formerly an abbey.
<b>abbot</b>	A man who is the head of an abbey of monks.
<b>archdeacon</b>	(Anglican Church) an ecclesiastical dignitary usually ranking just below a bishop.
<b>augustinian</b>	A Roman Catholic friar or monk belonging to one of the Augustinian monastic orders.
<b>bishop</b>	A chess piece typically with its top shaped like a mitre that can move in any direction along a diagonal on which it stands Each player starts the game with two bishops one moving on white squares and the other on black.
<b>buddhism</b>	A religion represented by the many groups (especially in Asia) that profess various forms of the Buddhist doctrine and that venerate Buddha.
<b>buddhist</b>	Of or relating to or supporting Buddhism.
<b>canon</b>	A rule or especially body of rules or principles generally established as valid and fundamental in a field of art or philosophy. <i>Canons of polite society.</i>
<b><a href="#">cathedral</a></b>	The principal Christian church building of a bishop’s diocese. <i>St Paul's <b>Cathedral</b>.</i>
<b>catholic</b>	Free from provincial prejudices or attachments. <i>Her tastes are pretty <b>catholic</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">christian</a></b>	Relating to or characteristic of Christianity.
<b>cloister</b>	Surround with a cloister. <i>She <b>cloistered</b> herself in the office.</i>
<b><a href="#">congregation</a></b>	A group of people assembled for religious worship. <i>Large <b>congregations</b> of birds may cause public harm.</i>

<b>defrock</b>	Divest of the frock; of church officials. <i>The Supreme Court found him in contempt of the tribunal and <b>defrocked</b> him as an appeals court judge.</i>
<b>gothic</b>	Of or relating to the Goths. <i><b>Gothic</b> novels like <i>Frankenstein</i>.</i>
<b>holy</b>	(of a person) devoted to the service of God. <i>Saints and <b>holy</b> men.</i>
<b>minster</b>	Any of certain cathedrals and large churches; originally connected to a monastery. <i>York <b>Minster</b>.</i>
<b>monastery</b>	The residence of a religious community.
<b>monastic</b>	A monk or other follower of a monastic rule. <i>She set her things round the <b>monastic</b> student bedroom.</i>
<b>monk</b>	A male religious living in a cloister and devoting himself to contemplation and prayer and work.
<b>pagoda</b>	An ornamental imitation of a Hindu or Buddhist pagoda.
<b>pastor</b>	Be pastor of a church or congregation. <i>He continued to study law while <b>pastoring</b> in Chelsea.</i>
<b>priest</b>	Ordain to the priesthood. <i>The plays were performed within the sacred area of Dionysus in the presence of his <b>priest</b>.</i>
<b>priory</b>	Religious residence in a monastery governed by a prior or a convent governed by a prioress.
<b>rector</b>	(in the Roman Catholic Church) a priest in charge of a church or of a religious institution.
<b>religion</b>	A particular system of faith and worship. <i>The world's great <b>religions</b>.</i>
<b>saint</b>	Declare a dead person to be a saint. <i>The sandy shores of the River Nid where Holy Olaf's bones were laid to rest before he had been <b>sainted</b>.</i>
<b>shrine</b>	Enshrine. <i>A Hindu <b>shrine</b> at which offerings are placed twice a day.</i>
<b>temple</b>	A thing regarded as holy or likened to a temple especially a person's body. <i>The veins in his <b>temple</b> throbbed.</i>
