## Associations of "For city" (30 Words)

<b>autonomous</b>	(of a country or region) having the freedom to govern itself or control its own affairs. <i>The federation included sixteen <b>autonomous</b> republics.</i>
<b>borough</b>	A town or district which is an administrative unit.
<b>capital</b>	(of a letter of the alphabet) large in size and of the form used to begin sentences and names. <i>Our <b>capital</b> concern was to avoid defeat.</i>
<b>community</b>	Joint ownership or liability. <i><b>Community</b> health services.</i>
<a href="#"><u>constituency</u></a>	A group of people with shared interests or political opinions. <i>Most politicians are more interested in the voice of their <b>constituency</b>.</i>
<b>county</b>	A sporting team playing for a county. <i>The <b>county</b> plans to build a new road.</i>
<b>depopulate</b>	Substantially reduce the population of (an area). <i>The epidemic <b>depopulated</b> the countryside.</i>
<a href="#"><u>district</u></a>	Regulate housing in; of certain areas of towns. <i>A <b>district</b> health authority.</i>
<a href="#"><u>domestic</u></a>	Converted or adapted to domestic use. <i>They are often called to sort out a <b>domestic</b>.</i>
<b>downtown</b>	The downtown area of a town or city. <i>A <b>downtown</b> bar.</i>
<b>enfranchise</b>	Grant voting rights. <i>Slaves were <b>enfranchised</b> in the mid 19th century.</i>
<a href="#"><u>local</u></a>	A local branch of an organization especially a trade union. <i><b>Local</b> anesthesia.</i>
<b>locality</b>	A surrounding or nearby region. <i>She had few friends in the <b>locality</b>.</i>

<b>metropolitan</b>	Relating to or denoting a metropolitan or his see. <i>A <b>metropolitan</b> bishop.</i>
<b>municipal</b>	Of or relating to the government of a municipality. <i>International law only authorizes a belligerent to punish a spy under its <b>municipal</b> law.</i>
<b>municipality</b>	The governing body of a municipality. <i>Voters in each <b>municipality</b> choose between four candidates.</i>
<u>neighborhood</u>	People living near one another. <i>My <b>neighborhood</b> voted for Bush.</i>
<b>populous</b>	Densely populated. <i>The <b>populous</b> city of Shanghai.</i>
<b>prefecture</b>	A prefect's office or tenure. <i>Enraged fans besieged the <b>Prefecture</b> of Police.</i>
<u>province</u>	Northern Ireland. <i>I made my way home to the dreary <b>provinces</b> by train.</i>
<u>provincial</u>	Characteristic of the provinces or their people. <i><b>Provincial</b> towns.</i>
<b>quarter</b>	Cut a log into quarters and these into planks so as to show the grain well. <i>He surrendered but asked for <b>quarter</b>.</i>
<u>slum</u>	Spend time at a lower socio-economic level than one's own, motivated by curiosity or desire for adventure; usage considered condescending and insensitive. <i><b>Slum</b> dwellers.</i>
<b>sophisticate</b>	Make someone or something more sophisticated. <i>He is still the butt of jokes made by New York <b>sophisticates</b>.</i>
<b>subdivide</b>	Divide (something that has already been divided or that is a separate unit). <i>The cells <b>subdivided</b>.</i>
<b>suburban</b>	Contemptibly dull and ordinary. <i><b>Suburban</b> life.</i>
<u>town</u>	The particular town under consideration especially one's own town. <i>A rift between the city's <b>town</b> and gown.</i>
<b>urban</b>	Relating to or concerned with a city or densely populated area. <i><b>Urban</b> manners.</i>
<u>village</u>	A self-contained district or community within a town or city regarded as having features characteristic of village life. <i>Pretty fishing <b>villages</b>.</i>
