| <b><a href="#">comprise</a></b>   | Make up or constitute (a whole).<br><i>This single breed <b>comprises</b> 50 per cent of the Swiss cattle population.</i>   |
| <b>connote</b>                    | Involve as a necessary condition of consequence; as in logic.<br><i>The term modern science usually <b>connotes</b> a complete openness to empirical testing.</i>   |
| <b><a href="#">constitute</a></b> | Set up or lay the groundwork for.<br><i>There were enough members present to <b>constitute</b> a quorum.</i>  |
| <b>contain</b>                    | Include or contain have as a component.<br><i>This can <b>contains</b> water.</i>   |
| <b>element</b>                    | Each of more than one hundred substances that cannot be chemically interconverted or broken down into simpler substances and are primary constituents of matter Each element is distinguished by its atomic number i e the number of protons in the nuclei of its atoms.<br><i>The grammatical <b>elements</b> of a sentence.</i> |
| <b>encompass</b>                  | Surround and have or hold within.<br><i>This area of London <b>encompasses</b> Piccadilly to the north and St James s Park to the south.</i>  |
| <b><a href="#">entail</a></b>     | A property bequeathed under an entail.<br><i>Landed property was governed by primogeniture and <b>entail</b>.</i>   |
| <b>entangle</b>                   | Involve (someone) in difficulties or complicated circumstances from which it is difficult to escape.<br><i>They were suspicious of becoming <b>entangled</b> in a civil war.</i>  |

| <b>factor</b>         | Resolve into factors.<br><i>His skill was a <b>factor</b> in ensuring that so much was achieved.</i>  |
| <b>have</b>           | Have sex with.<br><i>I don t <b>have</b> any money left.</i>  |
| <b>implicate</b>      | Convey (a meaning) indirectly through what one says, rather than stating it explicitly.<br><i>By saying that coffee would keep her awake Mary <b>implicated</b> that she didn t want any.</i> |
| <b>implicit</b>       | With no qualification or question; absolute.<br><i>An <b>implicit</b> agreement not to raise the subject.</i>   |
| <b>include</b>        | Comprise or contain as part of a whole.<br><i>Other changes <b>included</b> the abolition of the death penalty.</i>   |
| <b>incorporate</b>    | Include or contain; have as a component.<br><i>Through an <b>incorporate</b> resilience slighted confidence restores itself.</i>  |
| <b>largely</b>        | On a large scale.<br><i>He was soon arrested <b>largely</b> through the efforts of Tom Poole.</i>   |
| <b>mainly</b>         | For the most part.<br><i>The west will be <b>mainly</b> dry.</i>  |
| <b>makeup</b>         | An event that is substituted for a previously cancelled event.<br><i>He missed the test and had to take a <b>makeup</b>.</i>  |
| <b>mostly</b>         | Usually; generally.<br><i>I made some good friends but <b>mostly</b> met closed minded people.</i>  |
| <b>normally</b>       | Under normal or usual conditions; as a rule.<br><i><b>Normally</b> it takes three or four years to complete the training.</i>   |
| <b>ordinarily</b>     | Under normal conditions.<br><i>A person who is <b>ordinarily</b> resident in the United Kingdom.</i>  |
| <b>organize</b>       | Make arrangements or preparations for (an event or activity).<br><i><b>Organize</b> lessons in a planned way.</i>   |
| <b>overwhelmingly</b> | To a very great degree or with a great majority.<br><i>The candy looked <b>overwhelmingly</b> desirable to the dieting man.</i>   |
| <b>primarily</b>      | Of primary import.<br><i>This is <b>primarily</b> a question of economics.</i>  |
| <b>principally</b>    | For the most part; chiefly.<br><i>He was <b>principally</b> a landscape painter.</i>  |
| <b>redefine</b>       | Define again or differently.<br><i>She <b>redefined</b> his duties.</i>   |
